Carol and Steve Persche traveled in May to Cornwall, England, with a Connecticut Friendship Force club. Carol has provided us with the wonderful account of their journey and they encourage other members to consider traveling with other clubs.

This was our third outbound journey since joining Friendship Force in 2014. Of the ten people on this journey, three were from Connecticut, two from Vancouver, two from Arizona, one from Australia and Steve and I.

We flew from RDU arriving in London early morning, followed by a six-hour bus ride to get to Cornwall. We were met by our delightful hosts, Robin and Josie, and enjoyed a nice dinner and met their three pets (a dog, a cat, and a tortoise). They have a beautiful hundred-year-old stone house surrounded by Cornwall hedges and includes an outstanding vegetable garden and lovely flowering shrubs. We enjoyed Josie's fruit jams

with our morning toast and, if time permitted after breakfast, we were able to take the dog Rookie for a walk on one of the many nearby paths.

Our first outing was to the Eden project, a group of biomes (a biome is a community of flora and fauna) built in a huge, reclaimed clay pit. It houses plants from all around the world.



Day two we visited Lanhydrock estate where we could stroll through gardens and tour the



house which originated in the 17th century.

On our free day, our hosts drove us down the southwest coast of Cornwall and stopped at fishing villages and beaches along the way.

The following day was a visit to Saint Michaels Mount in West Cornwall. This was a highlight of the trip because

it is on an island and the only way to get

there is to cross a causeway which is underwater most of the time.

On our last day, we visited the Lost Gardens of Heligan, an estate lost in brambles since the outbreak of World War I. The gardens were rediscovered in 1990 and became Europe's largest garden restoration project.

We even became accustomed to having cream-tea in the afternoon, which is tea and scones

The Cornwall club did an outstanding job of planning and hosting our group from the states. We made a lasting friendship with our hosts, Josie and Robin, and have been invited to come back again. We've invited them to come to North Carolina.

After our week in Cornwall, we added another five days of vacation in Bath, England.

Our next Friendship Force journey will be in November to the north island of New Zealand where we'll be staying with the family that stayed with us in 2017.
