OPEN WORLD MOLDOVA EXCESS FUNDS TO BE USED FOR UKRAINE

In May our club hosted local government officials from Moldova as part of the Open World Program and the Congressional Office for International Leadership on behalf of Friendship Force International. As hosts, we received funds to support the program and had more than \$1,000 in excess of our expenses. Judy Wilkes, Host Coordinator and Board Member, suggested that our club donate \$1,000 to the Moldova World Children's Fund, an organization that she knows well. When Judy contacted Ray West, President of MWCF, she learned that Ray was currently in Moldova and he felt that the greatest need was assistance to Ukraine.

In Ray's words: "The greatest immediate need is dealing with Russia's heightened aerial attacks on civilian targets inside neighboring Ukraine. Evidently military-appearing vehicles and unmistakable ambulances attempting to evacuate wounded victims to medical facilities are subsequently being targeted. More civilian-type, every day-use looking vehicles which can be reconfigured and repainted for transporting severely injured people is critical. The Ukrainian Ambassador to Moldova shared this need with me three days ago at his embassy office. I am within \$5,000 of being able to purchase such an all-terrain vehicle. The remaining \$1,000 of the Moldova Open World program would go a long way in speeding up the attainment of this goal."

The FFR Board voted to send \$1,000 to the Moldova World Children's Fund, a 501(c) (3) organization, to help to purchase this vehicle to be used to transport injured people in Ukraine.
