PROGRAMS– AFRICAN ADINKRA SYMBOLS

Come join us for a lecture on African Adinkra Symbols given by Kena Dorsey.



Kena will also be doing a workshop for us on Saturday, July 11th on an African Adinkra symbol table runner. If you haven't signed up yet make sure to during the meeting as it looks to be a great workshop!

Participants can purchase a kit. The student price for kits is \$45 (regularly \$55). The kit includes the pattern, and everything needed to complete the quilt top. It also includes (3) precut and fused iron-on Adinkra appliqué symbols, so you don't have to worry about cutting out the appliqué shapes. Binding is not included in the kits, but options are available for purchase. Participants are also welcome to use their own stash.

COMMUNITY SERVICE – VETERNS

We are waiting on a reply from our VA contact at CalVet to set up our next delivery.

Thank you to those who have provided vests (clothing protectors), bags for use with walkers, and quilts of all sizes and shapes. This time we are providing some smaller quilts that can be used with a hanging system that will not damage the walls. We also have several wheelchair/lap and bed quilts.

At our July meeting we will have the following types of items for your support:

- 1) kits to put together "block kits". These include zip lock bags to hold the kit, instruction page, cut pieces from fabrics provided. This will make 7 to 12 blocks which can be used to make any size quilt we donate (wheelchair, small or lap, bed topper (for use in care facilities), and single to double bed size.
- 2) block kits like the ones we do for our block of the month effort. These are a single block, pattern and precut pieces to be assembled. We have a variety of blocks that you can try.
- 3) Top assembly kits. These are composed of blocks and possibly sashing and borders to make a top. General instructions are provided based on the number of blocks for different sized quilts
- 4) Pre-basted small quilts that can be quilted on a home machine. One large quilt that is looking for a longarm quilter. Backs and batting are provided.
- 5) Binding on completed quilts. The fabric is provided but doesn't need to be added by the previous step
- 6) Kits for the clothing protectors (vests).

A big thank you to everyone who has helped with any step in this process. We do offer tickets for the community service drawing. If you wish to participate, the ladies handling the senior center project will give you the tickets.

COMMUNITY SERVICE – GUIDE DOGS

Thanks to everyone who has picked up one of the patterns for this year's donation quilt. They are a piecing block that is designed to create a more realistic look. Half the patterns were picked up at our June meeting. We have about 15 left. They will be available at our July meeting. The blocks need to be returned by August so this will be the last time we offer them. We have redesigned the companion blocks for the paws and added a bone block to be done as a fusible applique. These blocks will be used in the borders of the quilt. They are already fused and will need someone to sew using a stitch like the blanket stitch.

Our schedule is to complete the top in September so it may be displayed at our show in October. The quilter will receive it after the show. It will be returned to us before the January meeting (2027). We will be giving the finished project to a representative at that meeting.

For those who are unfamiliar with this service project, we provide a quilt to GDA every other year. There is another guild that we alternate with. The quilt is used to raise money to support their programs breeding and raising dogs for the blind. Recently they joined with Tender Loving Care, a group that provides dogs to veterans, children with autism and facility dogs. Dogs are raised with the help of "puppy raisers" who participate in a program to train and evaluate each dog for its future role.

SCVQG Block of the Month

June 2026

Two For One: One Block-Around the World and HST Flying Geese

You will make one block that is 11.5" UNFINISHED.

You will also make a second block that is 7" UNFINISHED.

For each block, you will need to cut the following from the fabric provided:

<u>Fabric/Color</u>	<u>Cut Size</u>	<u>Quantity</u>
Black fabric		
- Background	6" x 6"	4
Grey Fabric		
- Corner Squares	4 1/2" x 4 1/2"	4

SEW ALL SEAMS AT 1/4"

Step 1:

On all (4) of the Grey squares:

- Draw a diagonal line on the back from one corner to its opposite corner.
- Draw a second diagonal line 1/2" from the first drawn line.

Step 2:

Place one of the 4 1/2" Grey squares right sides together with a 6" Black square, in the upper right corner of the Black square. The second, shorter drawn line should be closest to the corner. Sew on BOTH diagonal lines.

Step 3:

Cut in the middle of the two sewn lines (your cut line should be 1/4" from each of the sewn lines) to create (2) blocks: one 6" Black block with a Grey snowball, and one 3 3/4" half square triangle.

Step 4:

Press towards the Black on both blocks.

REPEAT STEPS 1-4 WITH REMAINING FABRIC SQUARES TO MAKE:

(4) 6" Black blocks with a Grey snowball, and

(4) 3 3/4" half square triangle blocks.

Make the 11.5" BLOCK using the (4) larger blocks (Black with Grey snowball corner)

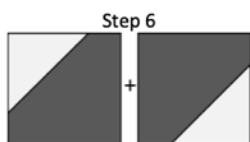
Step 5:

Top Row: Rotate two of the blocks so that the Grey corners face inward. The Grey corner must be in the bottom right of the LEFT block and in the top left of the RIGHT block. See diagram. **Double check that you have rotated them in the correct orientation!** Sew these two together. Press towards the LEFT Block and set aside.



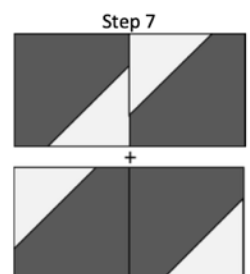
SCVQG Block of the Month

June 2026



Step 6:

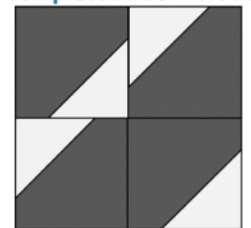
Bottom Row: Rotate the remaining two blocks so that the Grey corners face outward. The Grey corner must be in the top left of the LEFT block and in the bottom right of the RIGHT block. See diagram. **Double check that you have rotated them in the correct orientation!** Sew these two together. Press towards the RIGHT Block.



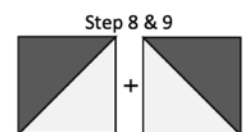
Step 7:

Sew the Top Row to the Bottom Row. Press Open. This block is complete.

Completed 11 1/2" Block

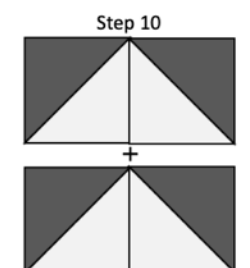


Make the 7" BLOCK using the (4) half square triangles



Step 8:

Top Row: Rotate two of the HST blocks so that the Grey triangles are touching and form a Flying Geese unit with the point facing UP. The Grey side must be in the bottom right of the LEFT block and in the bottom left of the RIGHT block. See diagram. **Double check that you have rotated them in the correct orientation!** Sew these two together. Press towards the LEFT HST Block and set aside.



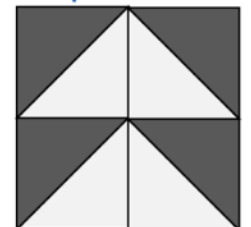
Step 9:

Bottom Row: Repeat Step 8 with the remaining (2) HST's. Press towards the RIGHT HST Block and set aside.

Step 10:

Sew the Top Row to the Bottom Row with the Geese points facing UP on both. See diagram. Press towards the Top Row. This block is complete.

Completed 7" Block



Double Check the two finished blocks match the "Completed" diagrams and are the correct size, then turn in to the BOM table at the next meeting. Thank you!



SCVQG Block of the Month

June 2026

If you choose to make these quilts on your own, you'll need:

- 5 yards of a background fabric (This is black in our example. You can choose any color in a solid, blender, or small print.)
- 1 3/4 yards for the corner pieces (This is grey in our example. You can use any solid, blender, or small print, but choose a fabric that has a high contrast to the background fabric.)

This yardage and the instructions above will make the following TWO quilts...

The One Block-Around the World quilt (using the larger blocks) will finish at 66" x 77" (without borders). 42 blocks in a 6x7 layout.



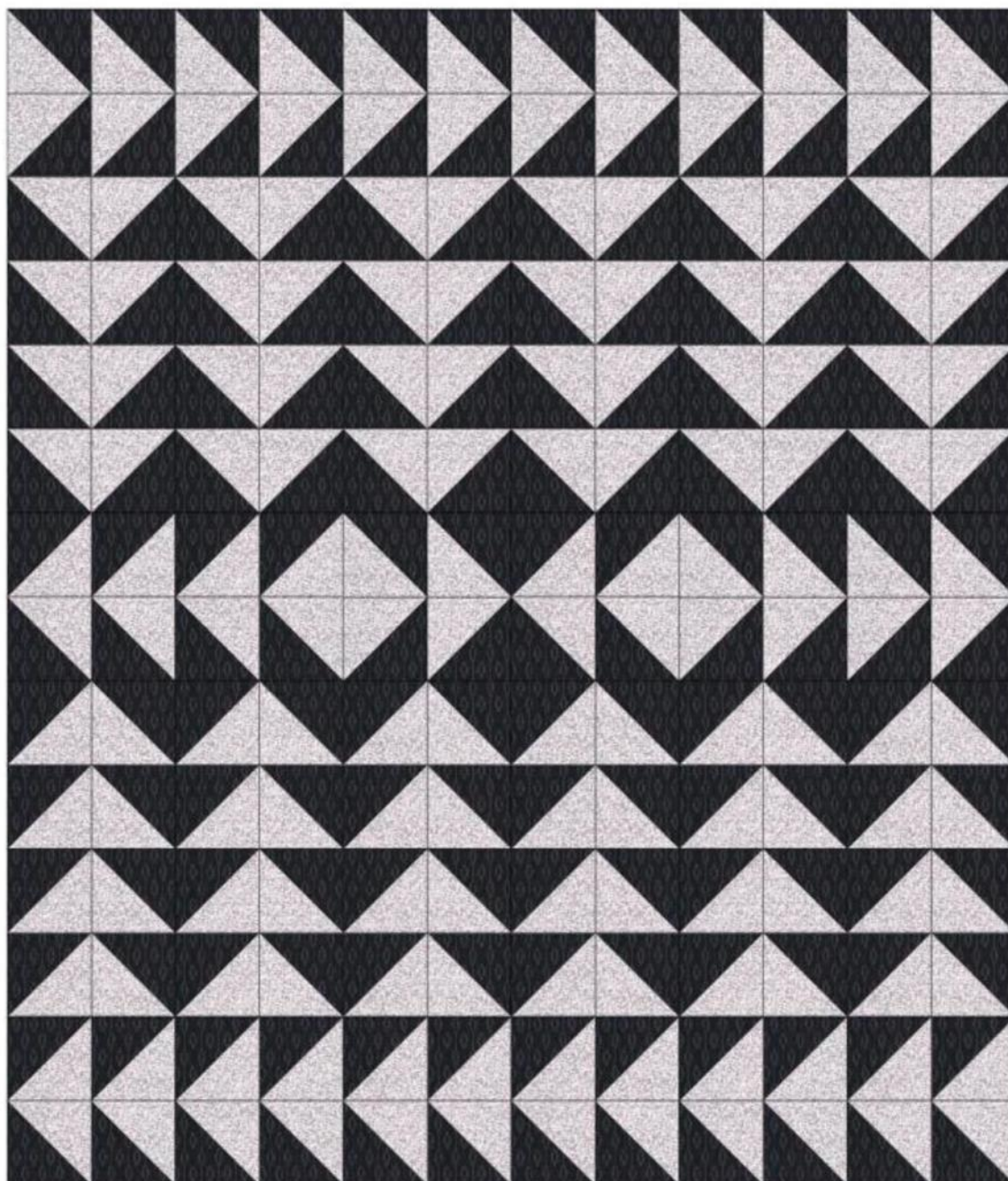


SCVQG Block of the Month

June 2026

The HST/Flying Geese quilt will finish at 39" x 45 1/2" (without borders). 42 blocks in a 6x7 layout.

Note, this is one suggested layout. There are endless possibilities with rotating the Flying Geese blocks. You could also add sashing or borders to make it larger.
