Our guild rocks! We have been able to touch so many lives this past year because of all of you!

Members are participating in record numbers, attending the community service work nights ready to participate. We have been blessed with quality fabric donations that have been turned into kits for pillowcases, quilt tops, placemats, etc. Thank you for picking up items at the back table.

This coming year we will be adding the Domestic Violence Center of Santa Clarita to our donation list. We will be donating pillowcases to them. Here are our donations for 2017:

• Turtle Camp received 13 twin bed quilts and 63 take home quilts this year!

- Cal Vet /VA received 3 bed guilts and 6 lap guilts.
- Habitat for Humanity is going to receive 26 large quilts at close of escrow (tbd). We originally thought this would happen in December.
- The Senior Center received the following and were so thankful for the items. They couldn't believe how beautiful they were!
 - o Placemats- 350
 - o Shawls- 23
 - Wheelchair blankets-25
 - o Lap blankets- 3

We are well on our way to providing 256 pillowcases to The Painted Turtle Camp in 2018.

We have contacted Henry Mayo NICU to see if they would like small quilts. More info in January.

We will have all kinds of kits available in January and through the year for you to enjoy. We have put together flannel receiving blanket kits to be sold in the boutique at Cowboy Poetry Festival and the upcoming quilt show.


