

#### Quilt Show 2017?

Wondering why we don't have more speakers, do more guild supported workshops? We do have a reserve, but there is a finite life. We are trying to perform not just our community service part of the 501(c)(3) status, but the educational part as well. Speakers, teaching, sewing, and workshops fall into this area. We used to have guilt shows that helped keep our budgets and various programs healthy. Like everywhere else, costs have increased speaker fees are higher, venues are more expensive, fabric is tripled in price per yard - or more. Our budget is almost identical to what we had in 1994. A show is a big undertaking, but it also meets our educational goals and provides public awareness of our community service work.

If we are going to have another show, we need at least 80% of our membership to participate. We have members seeking a location. We are looking at possible summertime dates. There is a great deal of preparation, setup, take down and a minimal level of monitoring on the day of show that need people's help. We need chairs for things like facility interface, publicity, quilt collection - hanging - distribution, vendors, day of worker scheduling, boutique items, food (if not available through the venue). Some of these areas can be a single person, most work best with 2-4. In addition, the day of show support is the ticket sales, quilt patrols, vendor interface (setup, take down, snacks, watching a booth so they can take a break or eat), opportunity guilt sales. There are more. We are

also hoping for a two-day show. The day of jobs are set at two hour stints.

I will be bringing sign ups to the meetings. We need to know that people will be willing to help - even a small job - before we commit to a venue.

## **UFO** Challenge




Fabric- light blue, green, pink
