We also had placemats that members took to sew binding on and placemats to sew up. And a big shout out to Delores for sewing on labels to items taken in that night. You made my workload for Friday morning much lighter.

We took in 7 completed placemats, 2 shawls, 4 rows of a rag quilt, 6 lap quilts, 3 turtles, 2 shawls and 1 twin quilt completed, as well as a twin quilt that needs binding sewn on. Yeah!!!

Summer Solstice

Technique: Pieced

Size- 12 1/2" x 12 1/2" unfinished

Fabric- white on white and blue

Cutting- white on white

1 6 7/8" sq. cut on the diagonal

2 3 1/2" x 6 1/2"

1 3 7/8" sq. cut on the diagonal

1 3 1/2" sq.



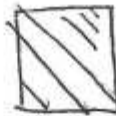

1 6 7/8" sq. cut on the diagonal

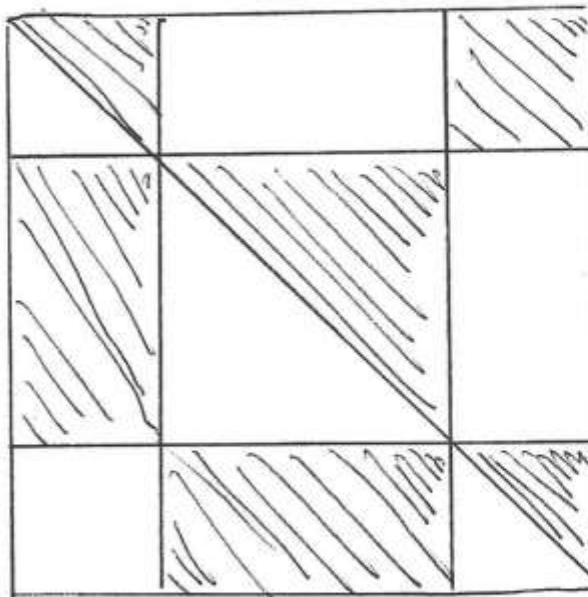
2 3 1/2" x 6 1/2"
