QUILTERS RETREAT - NOV 16-18, 2012

We've got a couple of retreat ideas in the works! One is in Pismo Beach (2.5 hour drive) in November 2012 and the other in Ventura (45 minute drive) in March 2013. You can come to both or just one, whatever fits your time and budget! Here are details about the Pismo Beach in November retreat:

What: a chance to get away with quilting pals to sew / eat / laugh together. You can work on your own project or perhaps someone wants to plan a group project? We can decide that as we see who signed up and what they want to do!

When: Friday thru Sunday, November 16 - 18, 2012.

Where: SeaCrest Pismo Beach hotel

Cost for room: \$119 (+tax) per night standard room with 2 queen beds - so this cost is shared! Includes continental breakfast, microwave and fridge in room.

Cost for sewing space: \$20 per person for the weekend for 24 hour access to your own table in our private conference room.

Other stuff you need to know:

1) You can share a room with another person to share the cost. In fact, if you want to lower the cost further, you can even fit up to 4 people into a room (I think the hotel charges \$10 extra per person.. check when you make the reservation!) You will have to find your own roommates and make your own reservations. When you call, be sure to ask for the "Santa Clarita Valley Quilt Guild Group" to get these low rates. Ocean View rooms are only \$139 per night.

2) Our conference room will fit up to 12 (or maybe 14) quilters comfortably. You will have a conference table (18" x 6') to yourself for your sewing machine, cutting mat, etc... so we are limiting the sign-ups to 14. You will need to pay a \$50 deposit to reserve your sewing space. The deposit will be used to pay for the sewing space (\$20) then the \$30 will be applied to your room account, so you will see that credit when you check out of the hotel.

3) Sign-ups will be opened to non-guild members after the July 12th meeting to be sure we get the minimum needed to secure the conference room. I will be keeping track of sign-ups and taking your deposit checks.

The town of Pismo, with lots of restaurants, is less than a mile away AND there are 2 quilt shops nearby. Chat with your quilting friends to find folks you want to room with. If you want to share a room, but don't have anyone in mind, let me know and I'll see if I can find you a roommate.
