quilts, help set-up and take down the frames and tables, organize our pot-luck lunch, and spend time informing the public that comes through about quilts and quilting. It's our day to shine!

Just a reminder to mark your calendars for our Quilt Show "If These Quilts Could Talk" which will be held on Saturday, November 7, 2009, from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm, at Bishop Alemany High School, in Mission Hills, CA. We are asking every member to try and submit an item to hang in our show.....from tiny miniature quilts, to huge, giant wall sized quilts....we love them all. We want wall hangings, baby quilts, table runners, any quilted items that you have made. We don't care if it is your 1st quilt, or your 501st quilt, we want it for our show. We want to show all levels of skill, and share our love of quilting with others.

New this year, we are offering our members the opportunity to sell their quilts. When you register your quilt for the show, you will be given the opportunity to decide if you want to sell that item during the show. A card with your contact information will hang next to your quilt at the show, so prospective buyers can contact you regarding the sale of your quilt. All we ask is that when you sell your quilt during the show, you donate 10% of your sale price back to the guild. This is a great opportunity to make money on the hobby you love!!!

We will also have an opportunity for children of all ages to participate in the making of a quilt that we will donate to charity. We are collecting muslin squares, cut 10" by 10" and crayons, so visitors can create their own quilt block, to be included in a future quilt that we will donate to one of our favorite charities. 
