The council meets quarterly at alternating sites provided by hostess guilds to discuss areas of interest to their member guilds, individual members who range from recreational quilters to professional quilters, and to their business members who own or operate quilt related business. At this time there are over 80 member guilds, from areas near central California, The Council is a valuable resource that links quilt organizations and resources, and provides a forum for open and positive communication.

My fellow Sew buddies, Nancy Mayer and Ellie Smith, did some pretty fun stuff this Friday and Saturday. We took a trip up the coast to Arroyo Grande and beyond for a meeting: Meet the Teachers. There were teachers from the California area that show the Guild representatives what they have to offer our guilds in lectures and classes. There were several interesting teachers I would like to take classes from. I will be passing this information on to our Program chairperson, Helene Younger. I also have flyers and information on coming quilt shows in the California area. My Sew buddies and I visited several shops on our journey. These were the best finds: The Treasure Hunt in Carpinteria, The Creation Station Fabric and Quilt shop (home of \$5.00 yard fabric!), Old Towne Quilt Shop in Orcutt (great find!), Quiltin' Cousins in Pismo Beach (we hit a sale 20% off everything and 50% of specially marked items), The Quilt Attic in Arroyo Grande (great shop) and The Cotton Ball in Morro Bay (another sale place!).
