GUIDE DOGS QUILT

This is our year to deliver a quilt which means I am about 5 months behind in letting everyone in on making squares. I need to get it done before March if possible. We need about 30 squares at 12 1/2" unfinished edge blocks (12" after being sewn into the quilt). Use fall colors and a beige background with at least one dog themed fabric included. If you wish to do applique or something similar with a dog printed fabric use the same beige type fabric for background where needed. Be sure contrast is good within the block! For instance, the beige should be very light so your blocks show up well.

To complete the quilt, we will have a sew day in late February to assemble blocks and add borders. We need at least 30 blocks to make this work. Please feel free to call or email me with any questions.

COMMUNITY SERVICE – VA PROJECTS

I had a slightly crazy afternoon driving around the VA facilities and later West Los Angeles and Santa Monica delivering quilts. I stopped first at the rehab building in the VA. They call it a Habitat for Heroes now. We counted 27 quilts - 4 laptops and 23 wheelchair quilts along with 7 clothing protectors. The ladies that work with the vets were very excited about the stylish ones that we made for them. They need more! Carolyn, in charge of the program, was showing off the quilts that you had made. She loved the curved or angled edges and the colors and patterns.

Next stop was the Cal/Vet apartments where I delivered 14 quilts, most bed size with a few that will be good for lap warmers. He said they would be grateful for anything we were willing

to give - including some of what we took to the Rehab center above. The Vets in the lobby were very interested in the delivery!

The last stop was to deliver a very heavy quilt that I finished from a donation we were given about 6 years ago. I haven't been able to find a home for it because it has a great deal of weight and warmth. I left it at the Sewing Arts Center in Santa Monica along with 10 tops (and some backs) that we have had in our storage for years. I know that because 2 were tops I had made or finished. The tops didn't really suit our current projects so they have been without a destination. The owner is quilting them to send to victims of the Camp Fire (the one that burned Paradise). They would prefer finished quilts as they are near their deadline. The owner is doing the quilting and she was very appreciative of the donation.

Mostly I wanted everyone to know how grateful everyone was. I was greeted with smiles, assistance getting them into the appropriate location and repeated thanks as I left. I would like to take another set of things to the VA locations about April. If any of you would like to go along, let me know so we can arrange the trip.

In the meantime, some of you have clothing protector patterns (they look like vests), bed quilts or are working on projects for wheelchair or lap quilts. If you would like to assemble some, I have blocks that are mostly red/white/blue and materials that will work for sashing and borders. These are in my garage right now. Give me a call if you would be willing to come take a few. I will be bringing kits to the January meeting as well.


