GUIDE DOGS QUILT

This is our year to deliver a quilt which means I am about 5 months behind in letting everyone in on making squares. I need to get it done before March if possible. We need about 30 squares at 12 1/2" unfinished edge blocks (12" after being sewn into the quilt). Use fall colors and a beige background with at least one dog themed fabric included. If you wish to do applique or something similar with a dog printed fabric use the same beige type fabric for background where needed. Be sure contrast is good within the block! For instance, the beige should be very light so your blocks show up well.

To complete the quilt, we will have a sew day in late February to assemble blocks and add borders. We need at least 30 blocks to make this work. Please feel free to call or email me with any questions.

Twelve Essential Quilting Tips

These 12 basic quilting tips will help quilters of *ALL* levels make beautiful quilts quickly and easily.

Paying attention to these simple details will help keep you moving through a project rather than having to stop and restart.

1. Read “ALL” instructions thoroughly before you begin.
Understanding where a pattern is headed and what supplies will be needed will help to get through each step with ease.
2. Use an accurate 1/4” seam allowance.
Accuracy is **key** in quilting. Spot check occasionally to make sure your seams are correct. Investing in a 1/4” foot for your machine will help. When all of the seams are the same size the pieces will fit together easily and the seams will match up neatly. Remember to *lock* those seams!
3. Always pin before you sew.
Pinning helps align seams properly. This helps you avoid having to rip them out later.
4. Always set seams.
To achieve a straight seam press the sewn seam flat. *STRAIGHT UP & DOWN* not sideways! Then press it in the direction you want it to lay. The finished top will be worth the extra effort.
5. Replace your sewing machine needle regularly.
Change your needle approximately every 8 hours of sewing time or for every new quilt top. Using a nice sharp needle will insure it moves smoothly through fabric and helps to prevent snagging, skipping and pulling.
6. Get organized before beginning your project.
Make sure you have all notions you’ll need on hand.
Pre-wind those bobbins!
Iron your fabric *before* you cut.
7. Keep scissors handy.
For convenience, store a small pair of scissors near your machine for snipping loose threads.
8. Buy the best your budget will allow.
Choosing **quality** fabrics and notions will make your projects more enjoyable to create. It will also help to avoid the frustrations that can come from using inferior fabrics, notions or equipment.
9. Just Start small.
If you’re new to quilting, making smaller projects such as your name badge, pillows, mini quilts and runners is a great way to build your confidence and skills.
10. Make Oversized blocks.
When making classic blocks such as Half-Square Triangles or Flying Geese, sew slightly over-sized blocks (If the pattern doesn’t already account for it.) Then trim them down to the correct size. The finished look is worth the effort.
11. Save leftover batting.
Scraps from larger projects are often a good size for those smaller projects and will keep you from having cut into your bigger pieces.
12. Take join or start a class.
Join one of our in-home groups. Getting some help and advice is a great way to hone your skills as well as meet other creative like minded people who share your interest.
