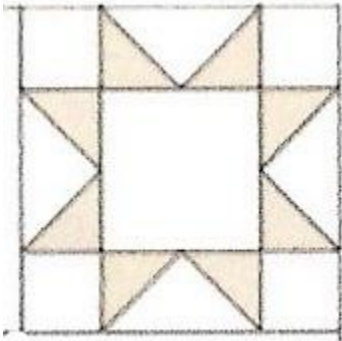


## Star Block Assembly

This is the first of two blocks that will go together to create a star and heart quilt. There are many ways to create the star block, but with the pre-cut pieces in this month's kits, these directions will work best.



Your block should be 12 1/2" UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 12".

For each block, you will need:

<u>Fabric/Color</u>	<u>Cut Size</u>	<u>Quantity</u>
White fabric (solid or small print)		
- Center Square	6 1/2" sq.	1
- Rectangles	3 1/2" x 6 1/2"	4
- Square Corners	3 1/2" sq."	4
Mid-tone Floral Fabric		
- Squares	3 1/2" sq.	8

### SEW ALL SEAMS A SCANT 1/4"

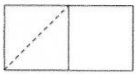

Using a ruler and pencil, draw a diagonal line on the back of the (8) 3 1/2" square floral fabric. Match a 3 1/2" floral square to the corner of (1) 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" white rectangle RST. Sew ON the diagonal line. (Fig. 1)

Trim Excess fabric 1/4" from outside the diagonal line and press to the floral fabric.

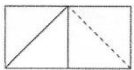

Match another 3 1/2" floral square to the other corner of the white rectangle RST. It will overlap a little at the center. Sew on the diagonal line. (Fig. 2)

Trim Excess fabric and press. This makes 1 Flying Geese unit.

Repeat steps and make a total of 4 flying Geese units

### Combine Units

Lay out (1) 6 1/2" white square, (4) Flying Geese Units and (4) 3 1/2" white squares.

### Combine Units

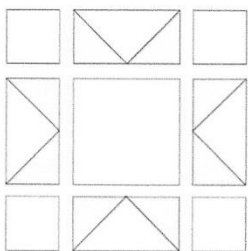

In Row 1, sew each piece to the next. Press seams to the white squares.

In Row 2, sew each piece to the next. Press seams to the center white square.

In Row 3, sew each piece to the next. Press seams to the white squares.

Sew Row 1 to Row 2, matching and locking seams.

Sew Row 2 to Row 3, matching and locking seams. Press.
