

COMMUNITY SERVICE - VETERAN'S PROJECTS

I was able to meet with Pamela White at the Cal Vet Apartments on Dec 12th. She still remembers coming to our meeting with joy. She is hoping that some of us would come down for a tour when things warm up so the vets can meet you! They have asked for us to come.

This time our donation was smaller since we gave her what was available when she visited us. A copy of the letter is included in this edition of the newsletter. This time we gave:

- 1 bed quilt suitable for the special care unit (hospital beds)
- 3 medium lap quilts
- 2 small lap quilts
- 1 pillow
- 5 wheelchair quilts
- 16 large vests
- 6 small vests
- 2 pocket chest covers

She was excited about the pillow (only said she will be getting a "where's mine" query) and the vests as they have asked for many things, but were especially excited about those. There are 396 apartments with at least that many vets and the special care unit. They are delighted with anything we make. It brings them joy to be given things that show we care enough to put work into them. They loved the fabrics in the vests - we got laughs about the batman and chili peppers on some of the smaller ones. The large ones were exciting too, different fabrics, a good size for some of the vets and the variety of colors and fabrics were pleasing.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

January and February's Block of the Month is called Shadows. This speaks to me at this time of year as some days are light and bright while others are just so dark. This is a fairly easy block to construct once you have the proper fabrics and cut the needed amount of 3 ½" squares. Make sure to play with the fabrics a bit to clearly see a light to dark change. And note that you will want to use a scant ¼" seam. Once you find the proper fabrics, you might decide to go ahead and create more blocks out of the same colors, and that is totally OK!

This is a great block for using scraps. Kits will also be available at the January meeting and sometimes at Quilters in the Park. If you have any questions, please reach out to me.

Your block should be 12 1/2" square UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 12".

For each block, you will need:

Seven different fabrics that go from light to dark. This can be an ANY COLOR. This can be accomplished using different tones, hues, prints, or tone on tone – as long as when you lay them out you get a change from light to dark.

Fabric/Color	Cut Size	Quantity
Light Light	3 ½"" square	1
Medium Light	3 ½"" square	2
Light Medium	3 ½"" square	3
Medium Medium	3 ½"" square	4
Dark Medium	3 ½"" square	3
Medium Dark	3 ½"" square	2
Dark Dark	3 ½"" square	1

- 1. Choose 7 different fabrics and cut the needed number of squares.
- 2. Lay out fabric squares to create the desired look.
- Using a scant ¼" seam and working by rows and then columns, sew the squares together being careful to nest your seems for a perfect finish. (Or you can work by columns and then rows, your choice.)
- Press your finished square so all seams lay flat then verify it measures 12 %". If it does not, check your seems and re-work to make correct.

FINISHED BLOCK

Block Size: 12 ½" Unfinished

Things to Remember:
