## PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Greetings! So much to share with you this month!

You have gotten the hint that the Guild is very passionate about labeling your quilts and telling their stories for present and future generations. I think it is beginning to make a difference in awareness, if not application. But historical record of quilts is a nationwide movement. Alex Anderson recently (July 17, 2023) interviewed a lady from Michigan State University (https://www.youtube.com/live/9y9zvzzb6Ug?feature=share) about the virtual resource, www.quiltindex.org. It is an amazing resource to find nearly 90,000 quilts categorized by pattern, year, maker, state organizations and museums. It is an easy site to navigate. The California Heritage Project is listed, and you can see the quilt made in 1994 for the CA Sesquicentennial celebration. Several of the speakers we have had at the Guild over the years, were among the Quilt artists. Zena Thorpe was one of the designers. So much out there for all your interests.

#### QUILT MAKER UNKNOWN

A quilt that is almost **220 years old** has been added to the collection of the Maine State Museum. Inscribed in the fabric with the year **1804**, this quilt by an anonymous quilter makes it the oldest known dated quilt in their collection. #### From the Maine State Museum:

"THIS IS Maine's OLDEST KNOWN DATED QUILT! THE QUILT'S MUTED BLUES, BROWNS, AND PINKS WERE MUCH MORE VIBRANT WHEN AN UNKNOWN QUILTER MADE IT ALMOST 220 YEARS AGO. ALONG WITH THE DATE 1804, AND THE INITIALS L (HEARTS) R, THE MAKER EMBROIDERED THE NUMBER 4.

THIS QUILT IS NOW THE OLDEST IN THE MUSEUM'S QUILT COLLECTION AND WILL MAKE ITS PUBLIC DEBUT IN 2025, IN THE UPCOMING EXHIBIT MAINE QUILTS: 200 YEARS OF COMFORT AND COMMUNITY. THANKS TO THE LATE JUDY ROCHE OF BELFAST FOR MAKING THIS BEAUTIFUL PIECE A PART OF THE MUSEUM'S COLLECTIONS.

They said the information from this program would be posted on the SCCQG website, but as of this writing, it has not been posted.

Top and most reinforced parts of the program included:

- Facebook: Never give out your full birthdate as easy for hackers to use
- Anyone can see your post in a social media public setting
- Website security: use a strong PASSWORD that is never shared is the best defense
  - ✓ Don't use pet names
  - ✓ Don't use the same one over and over again.
  - ✓ Don't leave it written in plain view
- Password Managers
  - ✓ Recommended to use a password manager application as a tool for organization
  - ✓ Password Apps (Google) are free and others may cost approximately \$25 or less.
- Heads up: Text messages, and even Facebook messenger, is not secure

## **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

This month's block is very simple IF you sew perfect 1/4" seams, press without distorting square, and then align on a rotary mat and cut. No problem, right! It utilizes strip piecing to create 2 blocks for only slightly more effort than one. Just take it one step at a time and you will see what I mean. Be careful to get the placement of strips, one color going from large to small, and the other color going in between from small to large. If you don't understand, take a look at the example of a finished top just after the instructions.

As the instructions say, it is very important to achieve a size of 10 ½" unfinished. If this is a challenge for you, practice with a few of your scrap strips to get just the right seam allowance.



### **Underground Blues**





Here is a perfect block to practice your ¼" seams. Being off by "just a little bit" when multiplied over several seams can add up quickly.


You will be strip piecing contrasting strips together and then cutting them into two blocks. Your block should be **10** ½" square UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 10".


For 2 blocks, you will need:

#### Fabric/Color

Two contrasting fabrics. One strip of each:

- Strip of 2" x 22"
- Strip of 1 3/4" x 22"
- Strip of 1 ½" x 22"
- Strip of 1 1/4" x 22"
- Strip of 1" x 22"
- 1. Using one of each strip width from two contrasting fabrics, lay out your strips as shown, going from wide to narrow with one fabric, then fabric 2 interspersed from narrow to wide. Take a close look to make sure they are in correct position.
- 2. Sew together in pairs, pressing seams open. (May press all one direction.
- 3. Sew the pairs together, pressing seams open. (May press all one direction.) Take a close look that design looks correct. It is very easy to get this wrong.
- 4. Measure the width of your strata. It should measure 10½". If not, please take a closer look at your seams to find where you can make adjustments.







5. When you get your pieced strips to measure 10 ½", cut your strata into two blocks of 10 ½". (I like to lay pieced strips on a cutting mat, lining up on a horizontal line and having the left side going to the edge of the mat. Then I use my rotary cutter to cut vertically on the "o" and then the "10 ½"). Then continue without moving and cut at the 21".)
