COMMUNITY SERVICE PROGRAM

I hope you enjoyed our community service presentation at the June meeting as much as I did. Featured speakers showcased five organizations serving residents of the Santa Clarita Valley:

Santa Clarita Valley Senior Center

Our guild members have crafted items for the Senior Center for many years now to include placemats, lap quilts and shawls to warm our senior neighbors. Diana Sevanian, R.N. the coordinator representing the Senior Center spoke about how much joy our gifts bring to the recipients. Diana encouraged our guild members to look into the many programs offered at the center.

✤ R.I.S.E.

R.I.S.E.- the acronym for Reach-Invest-Supply-Empower was represented by Meghan Simpson. They interface with several nonprofits to assist families in the foster care system. R.I.S.E. works to supply a store-front where individuals can select a variety of items that best meet their needs. Our guild has donated several quilts to this worthy cause.

Finally Family Homes

Finally Family Homes, assists foster youth aging out of the foster care system become self-sufficient young adults. Jacquelyn Vasantachat explained that these individuals range from 18-24 years of age and are engaged in continuing education and job training. Finally Family is engaged in building tiny homes and would love volunteers.

SCV Pregnancy Center

The guild has gifted the SCV Pregnancy Center with new baby bundles consisting of a baby quilt, receiving blanket, burp cloth, and a bib crafted by our members. Luz Machado talked about the wrap around services offered by the center. The center serves women medically, as well as emotionally in all walks of life.

Penny Lane Centers

Our very own Vickie Reti spoke about the organization that employs her; Penny Lane Centers. The founder of Penny Lane had a vision of a variety of walk-in services to assist youth that may be experiencing unstable housing, as well as assistance with family reunification, and those in foster care. The Guild has recently given quilts.

COMMUNITY SERVICE – CAL VET FIELD TRIP

A big thank you to everyone who has been finishing quilts of all sizes; wheel chair quilts, and even a few crocheted items. I was able to speak with Pamela White about our bringing a donation, which would include a visit. She is on vacation during the month of July, but said that August was open. Those I have spoken to felt week-day would be best - about 10:00am. I am currently offering August 16th (preferred) or August 23rd. We would be going for 2-3 hours. Carpooling is also a good idea, and I need volunteers to drive! I can bring 4 others in my car.

The Cal Vet home recently has had to close several of their units due to both deaths and a staff shortage. It has made it harder for them to keep up with the programs. When we talked about being able to visit the vets, Pam made the suggestion that we actually take quilts to vets in some of the units. Her only warning was that they would LOVE to talk with you. It would mean as much, or more than our gifts. She says they can't believe that we are still bringing them items. Why would these women care so much about them? The number we hand out would depend on how many of us are going. She has student volunteers who can manage any that are not distributed while we are there.

Due to the fact that our upcoming meeting is Trash to Treasures, we won't have a formal table set up, but I will take anything you bring back and make sure you get your tickets for the drawing. I will have some items that need finishing in my car: 3 quilts (2 larger) for binding, several quilts that need labels, some vests that need a small amount of work to be finished (buttons, velcro, pocket tabs) with what is required marked on each one.

The Monday Mavens have more than doubled our contribution for this visit, with some additional ones after this list was made. THANK YOU!


