BLOCK OF THE MONTH

It is fantastic that so many of you are taking the provided kits for Block of the Month and returning them in a timely manner - thank you! Wait until you see the tops made from the March and April blocks. They look fantastic, and you should all be proud of yourselves!!

In working with the blocks from the last few months, I want to reach out to some of you who are overdoing the scant 1/4" seam allowance. I think I may have scared you because now I am seeing seam allowances that are 1/8" which leads to a block that is a bit too large. So, I have removed the word "scant" from the instructions to help with this overthinking.

Remember that for May and June we are doing two blocks that work together to create a cohesive pattern. Because so many of you have been utilizing the kits, we are doing two

totally different color palettes. This month is the Chain Block which will connect the star blocks from last month. It is a fairly simple block that will really set off the star blocks. ***Please note that if you take a kit with the blue to coral colors, you will notice a pin in the top colorful 4 1/2" Square. This should become your center square. Then when the blocks are arranged there will be a color flow across the quilt.

What is the first thing you should do when you open your kit? Verify the size and number of pieces to the instructions. If something is off, please let me know. I am not perfect!


Pinwheel Parfait



BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Last month we made the star blocks, and this month we'll make the chain blocks. When we put the top together, we'll alternate those blocks to get the design below.

For a 60×60 quilt (no borders) you'll need 13 Star Blocks and 12 Chain blocks. Layout: 5×5 blocks.



Chain Block

Your block should be 12.5" UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 12".

(aka the blocks that go between the stars to connect them altogether.)

For each block, you will need:

- Rectangles	2 1/2" X 4 1/2"	4

- Small squares	2 1/2" X 2 1/2	8


USE 1/4" SEAM ALLOWANCE

- 1. Using 2 small Colorful squares, with right sides together, sew together. Press seam in one direction.
- 2. Using above and a white rectangle, with right sides together, sew long edge of rectangle. Press seam toward white.
- 3. Repeat to create 4 units.

Combine Units

- 4. Follow layout placement and sew together in rows. If using the *** blue to coral colored kit, note the square with the pin and place that square in center.
- 5. Press middle row seams toward center and top and bottom row seams toward the outside.
- 6. Nest seams of rows together. Press seams.
