## **COMMUNITY SERVICE - GDA/TLC**

With the help of Melissa Nilsen, we are providing block kits for a saw tooth star. It was cut to use the no waste method for the flying geese. If you are not sure about instructions, please reach out to one of us. I had 14 blocks picked up this time. The design of the quilt calls for 30 - 40 blocks so I will be bringing more to the April meeting. Fabric used in this quilt is from my stash of dog fabrics donated by many of you over the years. We chose dogs that were not too large for the 6" finished center and a small dog themed print for the points in the flying geese. Background is white. The quilt will have sashing that needs help piecing. I will be bringing fabric and instructions in April for that as well. Blocks are due back in August/September. The approximate finished size of the quilt will be 81x96 without any border.

Please note, the pieces for the flying geese finish at 3.5x6.5" before they are sewn onto the block. You may ignore cutting instructions and fabric placement in the handout itself.



White is the background block and the 4 corner squares (3.5"). There is a 6.5" center dog fabric for the middle and the other dog print are the squares for the geese small triangles.

Guide Dogs has an open house on June 8th from 10am to 3pm. I encourage you to go to the open house and check out what they do. It is a fun day and you can see why our efforts matter. They also sent a letter requesting donations as their response is much lower this year. If you chose to support them in this way, they have published a wish list through amazon at

Laura Hawkins has helped me setup 3 different red, white, and blue block kits for our veterans. You can also use your own fabric to make a sawtooth star using the instructions for the GDA quilt. These blocks will be used to create kits for tops that will be for wheel chair through cot or bedside quilts. The cot quilts are used in the special care areas where the vets need more assistance. The "cot" is a hospital bed. Please come by and check out the options and hopefully sew some up.

I also still have some kits made over the last few years with blocks donated from our guild. There are also kits for a variety of different styles. We had 5 bed sized quilts taken to be quilted that Marcia pulled out of storage - thank you Brandy and Lou. I will have 2 more available in April. If I have the time, I will also have a few spray basted quilts available for home or smaller quilting machine setups. These are a great way to develop your quilting skills. Backing and binding is provided for each quilt. Binding can be done by the quilter or the project can be returned to us for the ladies that enjoy this finishing touch.

## **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

In March we started a new community service quilt made with <u>Fancy Pants Four-Patch blocks</u>. This is not your typical four-patch construction, so please see the step-by-step instructions below. Please pick up a kit at the Block of the Month table.


If you still have kits to make the 6.5-inch nine patches for our baby quilts, please sew them up and **turn them in during the April meeting** so we can assemble these baby quilts. We appreciate the sewing you do for our community service projects!

Finally, we are excited to provide another set of instructions for the Mystery Quilt. Please note that the Mystery Quilt steps #7 and #8 are after the instructions for the Fancy Pants Four-Patch block.


#### **FANCY PATCH FOUR-PATCH BLOCK INSTRUCTIONS**

Please pick up a kit at the Block of the Month table during the April meeting.

1) Take two squares of fabric from the kit and put them right sides together. Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " down the right side, and a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " down the left side.




2) Cut down the middle. Measure twice, and cut once.






- 3) Open your two-patch blocks, and iron towards the darker fabric.
- **4)** Place the two-patch blocks right sides together, making sure the opposite fabrics are facing each other. You do want the dark fabric touching the lighter fabric. Be sure the seams are butted closely together.
- **5)** Put your seam horizontally, and sew down the right side and left side of the aligned blocks.



6) Cut down the middle.



You have made 2 four-patch blocks. Press the seam in either direction.



#### **MYSTERY QUILT INSTRUCTIONS**

Instructions for creating this quilt will be provided at the monthly guild meetings and in the newsletters from January through May. In June we will have a special "Show and Share" so everyone can see how these mysterious quilt tops turned out.

## Step 7: Combining results of Steps 5 & 6 to create Block #1

Make 21 square blocks with one **D-G-D** pieced between two **A-D-A** pieces.



Press toward the center bars. It should measure 8" square. Block 1 is complete!

#### Step 8: Joining background squares to accent pairs.

Take 21 B patches and insert between 42 accent pairs from Step 4 (patches F & G made into pairs). The fabrics should be lined up as fabrics 4-5-1-5-4. Press toward the background.

#### As a reminder:

Fabric 1 = Background

Fabric 4 = Medium Light Accent

Fabric 5 = Medium Dark Accent


