### **PROGRAMS – JENNY LYONS – FREE MOTION QUILTING**




My current work is centered around whole-cloth pieces, with intricate free-hand free-motion quilting. Because there is little or no piecing, the story is told through the line of the thread. I consider this work to be "sculpting" the fabric, since the stitches create line and shadow upon the quilt's surface.

### COMMUNITY SERVICE

I would like to take this opportunity to give insight as to the working of the "community service" storage unit. Looking at the roster, we have several new members that may find this information of interest.

The current process for disseminating fabric(s) from community service storage is, and has been, having the membership reach out to the coordinator of each of the organizations the guild serves. The majority of committee leaders are in attendance at our guild meetings.

Each leader will gladly meet guild members at the storage unit if that is their preference. We are also available via email or phone to arrange a time to meet that is mutually agreed upon.

Additionally, each organizer for each of the organizations we donate to almost always has items to be completed at the community service table at most, if not all, meetings. The majority of these projects have been assembled using the fabrics from our storage unit, i.e. placemats etc. for the senior center, as well as quilts and shawls. Additionally, the Veterans group, Pregnancy Center, Turtle Camp Bed quilts, donation quilts, R.I.S.E., etc. Pillowcase kits are almost always compiled from the fabrics in storage as were the aprons for The Painted Turtle Camp. We had quite a stash of already completed pillowcases to select from to gift to the Afghan refugees.

BOM has been the recipient of fabrics, focus, as well as blenders from that unit. I believe that the current BOM committee recently selected fabrics from storage with the assistance of administration - individual with a key.

The opportunity quilt chairperson, along with her committee, will select fabrics from storage once a pattern and colorway have been voted on. Melissa and Doryce, along with their committee selected fabrics for the last two opportunity quilts. Once Gabrielle's committee for the 2025 opportunity quilt has come up with a pattern and colorway, I will be happy to assist her at storage.

Ways and Means package up their selections, then return the remainder of the yardage to be cut into fat quarters for prizes at various meetings. Think Holiday Party, game night, challenge participation prizes.

Quilts that have been crafted for fallen officers' families, as well as guild President quilts, have come out of those fabrics.

We have been able to provide fabric for the following charities from our unit, Sew Powerful purses and Guide Dogs of America.

Boutique items have been crafted from storage fabrics, Cowboy Festival, Home and Gardens Show, Jinglefest come to mind - table runners, placemats smaller quilts have been and can be done so again. Arrange for a meet up!

There are fat quarters available for prizes as desired.

So please remember our challenge for each member of the guild is to make one placemat a month (that's only 12 for the year). ### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

MYSTERY QUILT INSTRUCTIONS – FINAL STEP

First, I would like to thank everyone that participated. I hope you had as much fun as I did. I cannot wait to see all your beautiful, finished projects.

STEP 9: Joining Half-Square Triangles to Accent Pairs

LAYOUT IS IMPORTANT FOR THIS STEP.

On the left, stack 42 half square triangles (patches made from Step 3) with your background fabric (patch C) to the upper left and focus fabric (patch E) to the lower right. Next to it on the right, place the remaining 42 accent pairs with the medium light fabric (patch F) above the medium dark fabric (patch G). To the right of this place the remaining 42 half square triangles with the background fabric to the upper right and the focus fabric to the lower left. Sew the three units together. Press towards the triangles.

Step 10: Completing Block # 2

The strips made in Steps 9 will be the top and bottom of the 9 patches. The middle strip is the strip you made in Step 8. Make sure the half square triangles are in the four corners, you're your focus fabrics facing the center block.


LAYOUT IS IMPORTANT. (Think of a Churn Dash). •Block #2 is complete and will measure 8".

Putting it together:

Row 1: 1-2-1-2-1-2 Row 2: 2-1-2-1-2-1 Row 3: 1-2-1-2-1-2 Row 4: 2-1-2-1-2-1 Row 5: 1-2-1-2-1-2 Row 6: 2-1-2-1-2-1 Row 7: 1-2-1-2-1-2

Border as desired.
