PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE FOR SEPT

Is everyone finishing their quilt show entries? The Quilt Show is almost here and hopefully we will have cooler weather.

August's meeting about the quilt show was very informative. Thank you, Jean C., for making it easy for members to input their quilt information into google forms, so that the quilt show committee members can start to organize the display of quilts.

Have you been watching Christina DC's gorgeous quilting on our Dear Jane quilt on Facebook? Thank you, Christina, your quilting is beautiful.

The board has decided to sell raffle tickets next year at Road2CA. Road2Ca is January 20 – 23, 2027 at the Ontario Convention Center. Our guild needs to apply and select the day we wish to sell our raffle tickets. To be able to sell raffle tickets at Road, we need volunteers to aid in setting up and take-down of the quilts, and white glove. White glove volunteers are the front line who protects the quilts, ensuring guests do not touch the quilts. The white glove shifts are usually 2 hours, and the volunteer gets free entry to the show the day they volunteer. When we get more information from Road2CA, we will have sign-up sheets for our members to volunteer.

Don't forget we also have our fabric sale coming up on Saturday Sept 12th.

Our September speaker will be our own member Connie S., and the topic is Landscaping Quilts and trunk show. Hope to see you there.

ELECTIONS

The guild elections are in November, but we need a slate of officers by the October meeting. The 2 positions that must be filled are President and Treasurer. Both candidates must be SCVQG members for at least 2 years.

President Position:

Will preside over all general, special, and executive board meetings. With 1st and 2nd Vice President, select various chairpersons for committees necessary for the welfare of the guild.

These are other duties of the President:

- Ensure that the guild and members follow the bylaws and standing rules.
- Be on the SCVQG bank accounts and be one of the signers to sign checks.
- Ensure that all the federal, state, and charitable trusts reports are filed on time.
- Attend the quarterly SCCQG zoom meeting.
- Prepare agendas for the general and business meetings. President cannot vote but has control of agenda.
- Approve all email blasts that are sent to members.
- Add information to the newsletter and review it before sending it out.

I spend 15 hours a month on guild business, not including special events and workshops.

Past presidents that are still with SCVQG are: Marcia D., Joyce W., and Denise Rifilato.

Treasurer:

Will collect and take charge of all dues and funds of the Guild and will keep a written account of all Guild transactions. Will prepare a monthly report to the membership on income and expenses, which will be published monthly in the Newsletter. Will prepare and file appropriate tax documents, raffle requests, and reports or any non-profit documentation. Will present a proposed budget, whose line items must come from existing chairpersons or officers responsible, in October to the current Executive Board. The Treasurer's books will be audited four times per year (as soon as the bank statement for the last month in audit is received) by different members approved by the Executive Board. The Treasurer will provide copies to the auditors who will report the results at the next regularly scheduled executive board meeting. Auditors will also give a written report to the Treasurer and President. Will also be able to collect mail from the P.O. box when requested by the Secretary. Cash boxes and seed money for all events must come from the Treasurer.

Other information from current Treasurer:

- The Guild utilizes Quicken for bookkeeping.
- You need to attend Business meetings on the third Thursday of the month.
- The treasurer has no power to withdraw from accounts.
- While some months require more time, on average I spend about 10 hours a month plus meeting times on this position.



- The right person is someone who already uses Quicken, thinks numbers are fun, and is not afraid of government forms.
- Will train the right person.

We hope to have the guild opportunity quilt displayed and have tickets for sale. We need a couple of members to set up the quilt and sell tickets.

We are looking to have two shifts Set up 8:45 am - 12:30 pm afternoon 12:30 pm -4 :15 pm.

COMMUNITY SERVICE – VETERANS

We have been given a date of Sept 1 from 10am to noon to bring our donations into the Cal Vet apartments. She was teasing me because my call to set a date apparently was the cause of lots of different groups getting in contact with them.

Good news! We have a variety of items to bring this time. They include 41 Vests, 17 walker bags, 7 wall hangings with "hardware" that will not damage their walls and quilts. The quilts include a single bed quilt, 2 table runners, 5 throw sizes and 2 that will work on the hospital beds in special care units. She was excited about the vests; they use them in the special care units and really look forward to getting more.

I will inquire about washing or other issues when I am there. The throw quilts will be going into a welcome basket for new apartment residents. One of the other organizations is putting these together. She wants to add some of our quilts to them. The roughly 48- 60 or slightly smaller will work for these. Again, I will ask for timelines and sizes at the visit.

Thank you to everyone one that has contributed. If timing is right, Patty Vergon will be going with some bed size quilts, and we will be able to hand them out to residents with Pamela's assistance on finding rooms where there is need.

COMMUNITY SERVICE – GUIDE DOGS / TENDER LOVING CANINES

I am really pleased with the blocks that have come back. We have 5 still out, some picked up in August. To get it assembled before the quilt show, we need either the blocks returned, or the pattern and kit returned at the September meeting. We must collect the patterns as part of the copyright usage agreement we have with the creators, so please return them if you were unable to finish!

Our members have done beautiful work on what was a lot of small pieces! Many of the blocks were posted on our FB page if you would like a preview! The best advice I was given late in the process was to starch the fabric, especially for the 6" sizes. It made it easier to manipulate and sew. Just something you can add to your own skills.

Gabrielle and I will be laying out the quilt and adding background to balance the varying sizes. I will ask for volunteers in September to help with the actual construction. After the show it will be going to Sue Handley who has worked with me to quilt it every other year, discounting the price for us. We will get the quilt back in time for the January meeting and we hope to have someone from GDA available to receive it at that meeting.

We will have a list of the contributors for this quilt at the September meeting for the label. Please check in with me!

Thank you for all the years of support and especially for this last one! I have had so much help with this effort since I took over from Deanne Palmer when she retired and moved to the mountains, then Arizona, I am afraid to list names as I will miss someone, but I do remember many years with both Lola Dyroy (also now in Arizona) and our own Melissa who both sewed and helped assemble the tops. Melissa also has helped with the blocks the last 2 times, and the patterns for this one. Thank you, too, Mary Moonitz for some of the patterns this time. The creators of those patterns will be acknowledged on our label. This year Gabrielle and I have been working as she will be taking over this effort from me. I will gladly pass on the dog related fabrics to her. I expect you will give her the kind of support that has blessed my efforts in this role.

HELP FOR WHEN YOU HAVE PROBLEM WITH BLEEDING COLORS

As mentioned at the last general meeting, we had success using Blue Dawn and warm water to remove blue stains when a couple of our DJ blocks bled. Melissa found an article that recommended this process of soaking the item in warm water and DAWN. We tried it and it worked. I used it on a pillow top where the red has bled. The plastic container was large enough to hold the pillow top I was soaking. We left it to soak for about 15-20 minutes. You could see that the water had turned color and the fabric was clear of the stain. I have done more research and Suzyquilts.com has an article how she saved a whole quilt with Dawn in a bathtub. She used **HOT** water and another article said use **COLD**. Sooooooooooooo mixture of opinions but they all seemed to work for the writer, Hope this helps if you get into this bind.
