SOUTHERN CALIF COUNCIL OF QUILT GUILDS NEWS

The Southern California Council of Quilt Guilds (SCCQG) hosted a booth at Road to California to receive monetary donations, as well as donations of sewing tools and quilts for fire survivors. They collected \$4,700.00 and many sewing tools. The monetary donations will allow SCCQG to purchase more sewing tools to help fire survivors reestablish their sewing supplies. SCCQG will be distributing the tools, as well as quilts, in the coming months. Any Guild member who lost a home in the fires will also receive a \$250.00 cash amount.

Outreach is currently being conducted to try to identify all fire survivors. Even though many quilts have already been donated, there will be a need for many more quilts and pillowcases in the future. Quilt donations will be gratefully accepted; however, they are requesting that quilters hold on to their donations until the organization of distribution is in place. They are requesting 60" x 70" quilts, but smaller quilts will be accepted. Pillowcases are welcome, particularly child related ones.

Volunteers will be needed in the future to help with distribution of the quilts to vetted survivors. If you are interested in helping or learning more about the progress of this effort, please check the SCCQG website at sccqg.org. If you know someone who lost their home in the fires, you can register their name on the website. Further newsletters will indicate when quilts will be accepted as well as opportunities for volunteering to help with the effort.

VA PROJECTS

How can you help with Vet projects? You can make your own or participate along the way. Fabrics, batting and backs are available in storage. While the vets do appreciate the red, white and blue, the ladies expressed a desire for flowers and bright colors. The men also appreciate outdoor colors. Projects can be pillowcases, wall hangings, vests (clothing protectors), and quilts from wheelchair to bed sized.

Option 1 - Use your own materials and donate the completed project.

Option 2 - Help with quilt steps along the way: Sizes wall hanging through large bed.

- Make a blocks (precut kits available)
- Sew top. Blocks will be kitted with sashing/borders and suggested pattern for assembly.
- Quilting - smaller quilts will be spray basted for small to mid-size quilting machines including backing and batting. If a binding was selected, it will be in the quilt kit but does not have to be part of what you do. Large tops will be combined with batting and backing but not spray basted unless requested, for long arm machines.
- Binding - make from fabric provided, binding strips can be sewn on, hand stitched or sewn both sides by machine. Double layer binding is preferred for better wear and tear.

Option 3 - Vests

- Pattern and fabric are included in a kit.
- Please complete and return finished vest and pattern.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Block of the Month:

Thank you to everyone who took a kit. I will have another set ready to go for March. If you checked one out, please bring it back finished, and we will check off your name.

Mystery Quilt Clue 2 has 6 pages of instructions. I have written notes below to help with the instructions.

My biggest recommendation is to starch your fabric. You will be working with triangles cut from the squares. Second recommendation is to use a scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.

Page 2: You will use only 3 of the $3\frac{1}{8}$ " x $3\frac{1}{8}$ " squares of your **FOURTH** color and **ACCENT** squares to make 6 half square triangles. Square these to $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x $2\frac{3}{4}$ ". To make the block pictured, you need 1 half square triangle unit you just made, 1 of your $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " **BOLD**, and 2 of your $2\frac{3}{4}$ " x $2\frac{3}{4}$ " **ACCENT**. Assemble units according to the picture. You need to make 2 of these, square to 5".

Page 3: Take the 4 remaining $3\frac{1}{8}$ " **ACCENT** squares and cut on one diagonal. Sew **ACCENT** triangles to each side of your half square triangles (from page 2). Pay close attention to layout, sew this unit onto the **BOLD** triangle (cut from the $5\frac{3}{8}$ " square). Assemble 4 of these blocks, again paying attention to your layout. Square to $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Page 5-6: Start with 4 of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " **BACKGROUND**, and 4 of the $4\frac{1}{2}$ " **BOLD**. Draw a diagonal line on the lighter colored fabric. Sew on both sides of the line, like a half square triangle. Cut on both diagonals (cut the unmarked diagonal first). Sew these triangle units to the **BOLD** triangle made from $3\frac{7}{8}$ " square. Square to $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Take the two remaining $4\frac{1}{4}$ " **BOLD** squares and two $4\frac{1}{4}$ " **ACCENT** squares. You will make two hourglass units with these. Trim to $3\frac{1}{2}$ ".

The last step is to assemble the units according to the picture, and square at $9\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Clue 2

This clue brings us the final setting triangles (those for the four corners) and a few more wonderful blocks. All the "hard work" we diid in Clue 1 means we get to sail right through this and future clues! Let's jump in and HAVE SOME FUN!

Corner triangles:

BACKGROUND	9" blocks	12" blocks
<i>7-1/4" WOF strips</i>	<i>Scraps or 1</i>	
<i>Sub-cut to 7-1/4" squares</i>	<i>2</i>

As in Clue 1, please set these aside for the lay out clue.

Block A: only two of these beauties

**This is the only time we need our FOURTH fabric. We cut too many (fourth fabric) squares, we need the same size square in a future clue, let's just cut them all now.*

We will start with those FOURTH and ACCENT squares of the same size to assemble HST units. We need 6 of these (measuring 2-3/4" or 3-1/2" now). NOTE: please set 3 FOURTH squares aside. You will also still have some ACCENT squares in this size.

Let's grab the rest of the small squares (2-3/4" or 3-1/2") to assemble these:

We should have TWO of these, measuring 5" or 6-1/2" now. I pressed the centre in a pinwheel to help keep it flat.





We need to cut the ACCENT 3-1/8" or 3-7/8" squares on ONE diagonal now. Using these triangles, the HST we created on page 2, and the BOLD triangles, we will create FOUR of these units:

You will need to stitch two triangles to each side of the FOURTH/ ACCENT HSTs before completing these with the BOLD fabric triangles.

Lay these out with the BOLD triangles pointing toward each other.



Complete, these should measure 9-1/2" or 12-1/2". I pressed the centre seam in a pinwheel to reduce bulk.



Blocks B and C: these are very similar, so we will cut everything for both, then assemble FOUR of each.

Let's start with the **FOUR** of the largest **BACKGROUND** and **BOLD** squares. We need to assemble these like we are creating HST units (draw one diagonal line on the wrong side of the lighter fabric, stitch 1/4" to the left and right of the line) except when we get to the cutting, we will cut on **BOTH** diagonals.

With these two colour triangles and the **BOLD** triangles we cut in the charts, let's assemble sixteen (16) of these units. Press toward the **BOLD** triangle and trim to 3-1/2" or 4-1/2" now.



You should have 2 (two) **BOLD** large squares left, we will mate these to the **ACCENT** and make some hourglass units. We will assemble these by first creating HST, then drawing one more diagonal line on the wrong side of two of our HST units. We will mate these opposite fabrics touching and stitch 1/4" to the left and right of the line again, cutting on the line creates our hourglass units. Trim after pressing to 3-1/2" or 4-1/2".





*We are ready to layout our two sets of blocks!! We need four (4) of each of these. Once you've stitched them, press away from the **BOLD** to help with bulk at the points. Watch the four with the hourglass units as they may need to be pressed the opposite way. Your complete blocks should measure 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" now.*



That's all for this clue...see you in Clue 3!



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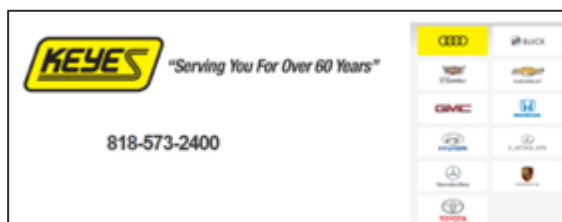
