## VA PROJECTS - CAL VET DONATION

Patty Vergon and Darlene Stump went to the Cal Vet facility in Westwood with me last Thursday (A special thanks to Darlene for doing the driving)! They were having a luau for the vets complete with Pacific Island Dancers (male and female) who were doing dances from several different island groups, including Samoa and Hawaii. They were outside and at the end we found out why - they used fire sticks for some of the last dances. We were given a table to display the donations, and the veterans were able to come by and choose things at the end of the performance. Thank you to the ladies who took the vest kits and got them back to Patty so we could add them! The work on everything was beautiful and we received complements and disbelief that they didn't have to "buy" them. I enjoyed talking to the vets. They have incredible stories and were asking if we could come visit on Veteran's Day. Our next donation trip is late November or early December.

We took:

12 Bed sized quilts 9 wheelchair to medium sized quilts 1 wall hanging Clothing protectors: 15 Large, 14 Medium, 5 Small

Veterans Support at Guild

We are working on making more options available for different skills and likes. Currently, we have block kits using patterns from old block of the month challenges with red/white/blue precut pieces. We have enough that there will be several kits at the September meeting with additional fabric to make tops for a wheelchair or larger quilt. There are other kits waiting to be put together for quilt tops from small to twin bed size. I hope to have 3 wheelchair/lap quilts spray basted ready for quilting. For long arm quilters, there are about 10 total bed size quilts that could use quilting (most are in storage). If you are willing to take one on, please let me know. I will bring one to the meeting and I am willing to drop one off if you are willing to donate the quilting. My binders are asking for work, so this last step is definitely not required by quilters! While Laura is making block kits with our red/white/blue stash, the blocks and quilts may be made with any colors or prints. There are both female and male vets so that can be a factor in your choices!

Thanks to Kendra, Dana, Jean, Adva and Dolores who gave extra hours to create 23 kits for the vest as requested by the VA. The initial sample I was loaned to create a pattern, was from



the Rehab facility. They explained that the design was developed to ensure respect for the individual and dignity to adults who needed protection from food spills. It was designed to be reversible, adjustable in the neck, and give the appearance of being grown up clothing. The kits have precut fabrics, buttons and instructions to sew the vest. Stop by and check it out. The sewing is the easy part!

Thank you to everyone that has donated to this effort over the years. If you choose, you can donate your own efforts. One of the first things chosen this time was a crocheted bedspread. We had a wall hanging/table centerpiece that I recognized from a long ago Debby Mumm workshop that a woman chose for a table in her room. They will accept wall hangings, table toppers, pillows in addition to the quilts and vests. They have their own apartments and like the ability to make the space their own.
