VA PROJECTS



The ladies asked if we could make some that had flowers and bright colors too. We accept pillows, wall hangings, quilts of any size and if you do knitting or crocheting, those are also welcome. We need to assemble 32 BACKGROUND/ ACCENT HST units, exactly like we have throughout the clues in this design. Once these are complete and trimmed to 3-1/2" or 4-1/2", here is the layout of our block.

So easy and effective. I love these. We should have eight (8) of these beauties that measure 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" now.



AND just in case you wanted something more to do before Clue 6, here is the binding chart.

These strip amounts are based on NO added border, for the size I supplied in the Fabric Requirements. They are also for straight WOF cut binding. The 9" block design should finish around 64" x 76". The 12" block design should finish around 85" x 101". These strips will cover you for these sizes.
