The speaker for the first quarterly SCCQG meeting was Dr. Linda Wilson, professor of Computer Science at Texas Lutheran University. Her topic was Private Security. How secure is your password?

Her password suggestions are:


- Don't share your password.
- Use a long password.
- Use a phrase and modify it, for example, Love forever more, Luv4everMor.
- Don't use the same password for everything.
- Don't use a password that someone can guess your password like quilting, your pet's name, or 1234.
- Use password management software like Bit Warden, 1 Password, Dashlane, Norton 360, or IOS password manager.

Beware of public Wi-Fi. There are fake Wi-Fi sites. Some sound legitimate, but not. Use a VPN, Virtual Private Network. Dr. Wilson spoke about VPNs and Wi-Fi routers in detail. If you are interested in knowing more, view her presentation at SCCQG.org and underneath Programs you can listen to or view her power point presentation.

Use a second email address for websites that require registration. Don't click on unexpected attachments. Don't use "unsubscribe" for unknown addresses. You are verifying that it is a legitimate email address!

"Meet the Teachers" will be on April 13. If you are interested in hearing what the teachers are offering for guild presentations and workshops, please let me or Marcia Dains know so that we can send you an invitation.





BLOCK OF THE MONTH

BOM Mystery Quilt Part 2

Step 3: Making Half-Square Triangles


Take 42 each of C (Background Fabric) and E (Focus Fabric) and make into half square triangles. Press to focus fabric. Trim to 3 1/2".


Step 4: Making Accent Squares

Take 84 each of F (Medium Light Accent Fabric) and G (Medium Dark Accent Fabric) and sew into pairs. Press to the darker fabric.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR NINE-PATCH BLOCKS


- 1. The block kit contains 2.5-inch strips cut from a darker and lighter fabric. Sew a dark fabric strip to each side of a lighter fabric strip, then crosscut into 2.5 inchwide units creating "Unit A". Press the ¼" seams to the darker fabric.
- Sew a lighter fabric strip to each side of a darker fabric strip and then crosscut into
 2.5 inch-wide units creating "Unit B". Press the ¼" seams to the darker fabric.
- Complete the nine-patch block by sewing a Unit A to the top and bottom of a Unit
 B. At this point, the block should measure 6.5 inches by 6.5 inches.


