## **PROGRAMS**

At the February general meeting, Marcia Dains and Dolores Roux-Jones will be demonstrating the process of English Paper Piecing (EPP), or originally known as Mosaic Patchwork, and possibilities of use beyond the traditional Grandmother's Flower Garden. At a March Workshop, the block created in February will be incorporated into a purse.

The 1" and/or 3/4" paper pieces will be provided. You will use 2.5" squares of fabric to cover the paper pieces.

#### Please bring:

- Thread (any color), Needle, Scissors and a table lamp for better visibility when you sew.
- 20 (2.5") squares of fabric. 3 different fabrics (2 sq), (6 sq) (12 sq) = 20 squares
- If you don't want to cut squares at home, 3 (2.5" wide) strips of fabric at least 30" long

They couldn't believe that others care enough to give them quilts like that. I have kits for a variety of sizes to make wheelchair, small to large lap quilts. The large ones work in the special care unit where they are on hospital like beds. I have both smaller (spray basted) and large (up to twin bed size) quilts ready to be quilted. The kits and large quilts are in blue topped boxes on my front porch. The spray basted ones got wet in the storms but will be out there next week. Please let me know if you would like to do any of these. I have those who love to baste waiting!

# IFFI Challenge



#### List and fee must be received by Joyce via mail or in person by March 10, 2021



## JANUARY & FEBRUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH - GRANDMA MAE'S ECONOMY BLOCK



Step 1



Grandmothers the world over know a lot about making do. They've been doing it for years! This economy block quilt is a favorite because it wastes so little fabric and looks so cute. Put together four sets of them for a quilt block that's granny approved.

Your block should be 7 1/4" UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 6 3/4". We will also add 2 sides of sashing making the final unfinished block = 8"

For each block, you will need:

<u>Fabric/Color</u>	<u>Cut Size</u>	<b>Quantity</b>
White fabric (solid or small print)		
<ul> <li>Setting Triangles</li> </ul>	2.5" x 2.5"	16
<ul> <li>Center Sashing Square</li> </ul>	1.25" x 1.25"	1
<ul> <li>2 Side Sashing Rectangles</li> </ul>	1.25" x 7.25"	2
Colorful Fabrics		
<ul> <li>Larger Squares</li> </ul>	2.5" x 2.5"	4
<ul> <li>Rectangle Strips</li> </ul>	1.25" x 3.5"	4
<ul> <li>Outer Sashing Square</li> </ul>	1.25" x 1.25"	1

#### SEW ALL SEAMS AT 1/4"

#### Sew the 4 Setting Triangle Units (Shown with Chain Piecing)

#### Step 1:

Center the long edge of a setting triangle along 1 side of each 2  $\frac{1}{2}$ " print squares from your set. Sew along the matched edges. Place another setting triangle on the opposite side of each square. Sew along the matched edges. Open and press towards the triangles. Repeat to add setting triangles to the remaining sides of each of the print squares in your set. Make sure there is  $\frac{1}{2}$ " left outside of each point and square each unit to 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

#### **Combine Units**

#### Step 2:

Sew a 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 3  $\frac{1}{4}$ " print rectangle between 2 units. Press towards the rectangle. Make 2 rows.

#### Step 3:

Sew a 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " white square between the (2) 1  $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 3  $\frac{1}{2}$ " print rectangles. Arrange the 3 rows you have created as shown. Nest the seams and sew the rows together. Press. At this point block should measure 7  $\frac{1}{4}$ " unfinished.

#### Add Horizontal and Vertical Sashing

#### Step 4:

Vertical Sashing - Sew one 7 ¼" sashing rectangle to right side. Press to sashing.

#### Step 5:

Horizontal Sashing - Sew other 7 ¼" sashing rectangle to 1 ¼" print square. Press to sashing rectangle. Sew Sashing to bottom and nest square seam to vertical sashing. Press seam to sashing. Block should now measure 8".

#### The finished block looks like this:
