VETERAN'S PROJECTS

I have mostly VA projects in various stages available on my front porch. Also there, a notebook and pens. If you would like to take one to work on, please sign out what you are taking (and number if above 1) with a pen from the "clean" mug and put it into the "used" mug. I will wipe them to keep clean. If you don't want to drive, I am willing to drop something off at your home. Email or call me.

If you would like, I also have a good bit of red/white and blue fabrics. Let me know if you would like some to use for your own project. The facilities have both mentioned wheelchair and laptop size guilts in their requests.

Boxes and quilts have been worked on in a sanitized environment - including me - and have been waiting for takers for several weeks. All quilts have the approximate finished size and approximate size of backing and batting that are included on a pinned note. Some quilts have binding included. Please be sure to return the binding with the quilt if you don't wish to put it on! For the kits, I would appreciate your including the pattern and reasonable sized extra or unused fabrics and the plastic container to help me keep kitting things! The following are dates when projects are available:

Today:

Large quilt box:

VA lap to twin size quilts for mid or long-arm quilters (more available on request) GDA Dog Quilt for their auction

<u>Small quilt box:</u> - spray basted quilts in wheelchair to lap size. 2 VA lap quilts

Drop Off Box:

For any projects being returned for any reason from "I can't do this now" to "I have done my part".

GDA Blocks - please include your name so I can be sure it is on the label!!!

After June 1:

<u>Small quilt box:</u> spray based quilts 10 VA wheelchair to lap quilts

Piecework box: - in sanitized plastic bags or Ziploc type bags

VA Kits for "tree farm inspired quilts. Fabric and pattern included

VA Kits for wheelchair to twin size quilts with completed blocks, sashing fabric and some with border fabric. Sizes on plastic. Pattern instructions included.

Kit for TC (turtle camp) twin quilt. Rainbow stars. Includes sashing and border fabrics.

VA Vest (Clothing protector) Kits

After June 16:


VA Kits for wheelchair to lap size quilts (until I run out of blocks)

BLOCK 2 - Framed Dog Portrait

Measurement when compete - 12 1/2" x 12 1/2".




Yellow corner squares cut at 2 1/2"

Blue sashing is cut at 2 ½" by 8 ½" and can be any complementary fabric that frames the inside

White center square is cut at 8 ½" x 8½" and can be a print with a full dog showing, a dog's head, an applique of a dog. Be creative but NO medium or small prints.

The quilt needs 25 blocks of which 23 are still needed.

BLOCK 1 - Single Irish Chain



Blue squares are cut 4 ½" x 4 ½" and will be from a small to medium dog themed print. Do not use portrait style prints as this will detract from the other blocks.

Yellow squares (12) are cut 2 ½" by 2 ½" from a yellow or yellow print fabric

White squares (8) are cut 2 ½" by 2 ½" from either the dog print used in the 4" squares or from a complementary background print.

The quilt needs 24 of these blocks

ASSEMBLY – will have 2" finished sashing of a complementary color or print. Cornerstones will be cut from a yellow print finishing at 2" to help the effect of the chain. 6" border of a dog print or complementary print will be added. Approximate finished size 112" x 112" or slightly larger.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Again this month we are all still staying safe by staying at home. I truly hope you are well and are keeping busy sewing all your UFO's or other patterns you have been wanting to do plus making masks too. I also hope you have found a little sewing time to complete some Block of the Month squares to make up some cuddle quilts for the special kids at Turtle Camp this year!

I presented a new Block of the Month last month – "Hugs" for the Kids. It is posted on our webpage online and also was attached to last month's newsletter. It is an easy one to put together using only 2 fabrics. I want to thank Rhea Fetter for making 12 of the blocks and then going ahead and putting them together with sashings to make a whole little quilt for Turtle Camp. She is a true inspiration for all of us. We will show it to you the next time we get together! Call me if you have any questions. \bigcirc
