2020 QUILT SHOW

- Go to the Group Page: Santa Clarita Vally Quilt Guild

- If in your roll, select the photo by touching it, press done, write something about the photo and press POST.
- If taking a new picture, take it, press next, say something about it and POST

VETERAN'S PROJECTS

I hope that you are able to find time to work on some of your ongoing projects, saved for a rainy day or when you get a few minutes free. If you want a break from them, or aren't ready to start the next one, we are offering some alternates that will help us get things to our veterans. Please check to be sure I have put them in the outside boxes before you come. I am starting on Saturday 4/17 to put together boxes that will have the projects in them but I am not leaving them out overnight.

I will be putting together kits for vests, small quilts and bed quilts (twin size). All things are still being requested by both Cal Vet and the Rehab Center in West Los Angeles. I am putting each project in some form of a plastic bag - fabric and plastic have been in the house well over a month. Quilt kits will include pattern, blocks and possibly precut sashing/cornerstones and border fabric. There are a few small quilts that will have only blocks and extra fabric to be made as you choose. The vests or clothing protector kits will have a pattern, the two layers for the vest, pocket fabric, buttons and Velcro.

The kits will be in boxes on my front porch. Sign the take out list so I know who has them please. There will be a box for returns as well. Again, if you can't come by but would like something, call, email, text me (use the cell phone number) and I will get them to you. To help me with creating the kits, please return the patterns when you complete the project.

Also available - small quilts in wheel chair (36x36 to 40x45) and lap size quilts spray basted. Large quilts (twin size approximately 60x80 but can vary). Large quilts are not basted but can be if you ask, and small quilts can be requested without the spray basting. If the binding is included, you do not have to put it on, but please return it with the quilt when you finish. At this time I do not have any quilts that only require binding.

GUIDE DOGS OF AMERICA QUILT

I have 7 Block 1s that have been dropped off on my porch bench - thank you ladies! I am having our editor Sue republish the pattern for this quilt with corrections for measurements to Block 2. Please make note! I look forward to receiving them. If you cannot drive here, let me know and I can come by to pick them up from in front of your homes. You can also drop them off at Joyce's home if you are going by there and she will get them to me.

If you are on Facebook, I have posted a picture of the left over blocks from the quilt we gave them this year (picture included here). I used them to make a 60 x 60" throw quilt that they can add to their auction. I need a quilter! If you are willing, please let me know by email, text or call (use the cell phone number) and I will figure out how to get it to you. I will also spray baste if that is what you prefer. The blocks have been in my house for several months. I need to make a label. I know Melissa made the border blocks, but I would appreciate getting the names of the makers of the dog head pattern and the 4 nine patch blocks. Please give me a call or email with your name. I am doing the label online.

BLOCK 2 – Framed Dog Portrait

Measurement when complete – 12 ½" x 12 ½".




Yellow corner squares cut at 2 ½"

Blue sashing is cut at 2 ½" by 8 ½" and can be any complementary fabric that frames the inside

White center square is cut at 8 ½" x 8 ½" and can be a print with a full dog showing, a dog's head, an applique of a dog. Be creative but NO medium or small prints.

The quilt needs 25 blocks of which 23 are still needed.

BLOCK 1 – Single Irish Chain



Blue squares are cut 4 ½" x 4 ½" and will be from a small to medium dog themed print. Do not use portrait style prints as this will detract from the other blocks.

Yellow squares (12) are cut 2 ½" by 2 ½" from a yellow or yellow print fabric

White squares (8) are cut 2 ½" by 2 ½" from either the dog print used in the 4" squares or from a complementary background print.

The quilt needs 24 of these blocks

ASSEMBLY – will have 2" finished sashing of a complementary color or print. Cornerstones will be cut from a yellow print finishing at 2" to help the effect of the chain. 6" border of a dog print or complementary print will be added. Approximate finished size 112" x 112" or slightly larger.

BLOCK OF THE MONTH


Again this month we are all staying safe by staying at home. I truly hope you are well and will let any of us know if you need our help – please.

I am presenting a new Block of the Month this month – “Hugs” for the Kids. I will have it posted on our webpage online and also have it attached to this newsletter. Call me if you have any questions.

I thought it would be fun for us to sew a bunch of “hugs” which we will turn into cuddle quilts for the special kids at Painted Turtle Camp. This block only uses 2 fabrics and is easy to assemble. I know you have some extra time now for sewing, so I encourage you to use this pattern or any BOM pattern to make blocks. So, get busy sewing! 😊

“Hugs” for the Kids – May 2020 Block of the Month

Block size – 12” finished. Your block should be 12.5” unfinished.


Blocks will be used to make cuddle quilts for Turtle Camp kids!

For each block you will need:


FABRIC, COLOR	CUT SIZE	HOW MANY
Print fabric -smaller scale:	3.5” x 6.5”	4
	2” x 2” Squares	4
	4” x 4” Squares	2
White or Light background:	6.5” x 6.5” Square	1
	4” x 4” Squares	2



STEP 1: Draw a line from corner to corner on backs of light 4”x4” squares.



STEP 2: With right sides together, layer the light squares onto the print 4” squares and sew a ¼” seam on both sides of the drawn line. You are making Half Square Triangles (HSTs).



STEP 3: Cut on the drawn line and press each HST to the print side.

TRIM squares to measure 3.5”x 3.5”. Make 4. Set aside.



STEP 4: Now draw a line from corner to corner on backs of the 2”x2” print squares. Place each square on the corners of the 6.5” light square and sew on the drawn line (Snowball Technique). Watch placement. Trim the excess fabric ¼” from the seams and press print triangles to the corners.



STEP 5: Sew a 3.5”x 6.5” print rectangle to each side of the snowballed center square. Press seams toward the print fabric.



STEP 6: Sew a HST unit to each end of a 3.5”x 6.5” print rectangle. Make 2. Press seams toward the print fabric.



STEP 7: Sew one of these units to the top and one to the bottom of the center unit to complete the block. Press.

You have made a “Hug” for the kids! XO


