PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy January, My Quilty Friends!

Well, we can kiss another full year of COVID silliness goodbye – and hope that sometime this year, we can actually see each other speak again! I was wondering what I could share with you and came up with a couple of things...

Thing One: Did you know your sewing machine will make clothes for family members if you ask it to? I haven't made adult clothing for decades – I forgot how huge a 5/8" seam is – but I made little spring jackets for my daughter-in-law and her mom for Christmas! They turned out great! I got each of them a T-Shirt to go under the jacket and Viola! A lovely hand-made gift!

Thing Two: I did a little research to see what the top five quilting tools of 2021 were, and here are the results:

- 1. Bias Tape Maker Kit by Madame Sew this kit comes complete with 4 bias tape makers and an awl. There are a couple of other things in the kit, but who cares.
- 2. Slotted Trimmers by Clearly Perfect. One alignment and two cuts square up your quilt block! Only problem is the tool only works for blocks up to 6 1/2". Quilt in a Day makes one that goes up to 9 ½". Just sayin'...
- 3. Alex Anderson's 4-In-1 Essential Sewing Tool. This includes a seam ripper, stiletto, presser and turner. It's made from wood and the seam ripper is as fine as the Clover seam ripper. Ordered mine!
- 4. Quick Easy Mitered Binding Tool I am still working on perfecting my mitered corners, so this is another tool that's on its way to me!
- 5. Heat Erasable Fabric Marking Pens by Madam Sew but I'm sure more than one of you currently have Fusion pens that can be used for this purpose maybe just not in white. I bought the Dritz version and they dried out before I could use them all. At any rate, heat erasable marking is the bomb!

So, if your partner did not get you any of these handy dandy tools for Christmas, I say you're owed! And, try making yourself a little something for spring – and rediscover the 5/8" seam! Keep on Quilting!


IFFI Challenge





JANUARY BLOCK OF THE MONTH — GRANDMA MAE'S ECONOMY BLOCK



Step 1






Step 2

Grandmothers the world over know a lot about making do. They've been doing it for years! This economy block quilt is a favorite because it wastes so little fabric and looks so cute. Put together four sets of them for a quilt block that's granny approved.

Your block should be 7 1/4" UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 6 3/4". We will also add 2 sides of sashing making the final unfinished block = 8"

For each block, you will need:

Fabric/Color	Cut Size	Quantity
White fabric (solid or small print)		
 Setting Triangles 	2.5" x 2.5"	16
 Center Sashing Square 	1.25" x 1.25"	1
 2 Side Sashing Rectangles 	1.25" x 7.25"	2
Colorful Fabrics		
 Larger Squares 	2.5" x 2.5"	4
 Rectangle Strips 	1.25" x 3.5"	4
 Outer Sashing Square 	1.25" x 1.25"	1

SEW ALL SEAMS AT 1/4"

Sew the 4 Setting Triangle Units (Shown with Chain Piecing)

Step 1:

Center the long edge of a setting triangle along 1 side of each 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " print squares from your set. Sew along the matched edges. Place another setting triangle on the opposite side of each square. Sew along the matched edges. Open and press towards the triangles. Repeat to add setting triangles to the remaining sides of each of the print squares in your set. Make sure there is $\frac{1}{2}$ " left outside of each point and square each unit to 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".

Combine Units

Step 2:

Sew a 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{4}$ " print rectangle between 2 units. Press towards the rectangle. Make 2 rows.

Step 3:

Sew a 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " white square between the (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " print rectangles. Arrange the 3 rows you have created as shown. Nest the seams and sew the rows together. Press. At this point block should measure 7 $\frac{1}{4}$ " unfinished.

Add Horizontal and Vertical Sashing

Step 4:

Vertical Sashing - Sew one 7 ¼" sashing rectangle to right side. Press to sashing.

Step 5:

Horizontal Sashing - Sew other 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ " sashing rectangle to 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " print square. Press to sashing rectangle. Sew Sashing to bottom and nest square seam to vertical sashing. Press seam to sashing. Block should now measure 8".

The finished block looks like this:



Here's a mockup of how it would look when all the blocks are sewn together.


