PREPARING YOUR QUILT FOR THE LONGARM QUILTER

- 1. Be sure your quilt top is ironed with seams flat. If you have a quilt top with no borders, the edges of the quilt will need to be stay stitched with a long basting stitch on your sewing machine. This keeps the seams from coming apart while being quilted. The top then needs to be hung on a hanger.
- 2. If you have a multicolored quilt top, select a backing that has the same colors as the top. This is very important if it is going to be custom quilted. Even an edge-to-edge quilt needs a back that will coordinate with the colors of the quilt top.
- 3. If you choose a light backing for a dark top or dark backing for a light top, there is no quarantee the dark thread will not show through to the back or front!
- 4. Your borders and/or the outside edges of your quilt should lay flat...if they don't, then the borders may need to be taken off and resized or the outside blocks of a quilt may need to be fixed.
- 5. Make sure your backing is square and sized to the quilter's specifications, ironed, and hung on a hanger. My specifications are 8" wider and 8" longer than the quilt top measurements. An 8o'x8o' top would need an 88"x88" backing. This allows the quilter to add clamps that keep the back from getting tucks.
- 6. Check with your quilter about the batting and thread. Some machines work better with different batting and thread.
- 7. No 3D embellishments (Buttons, ribbons, flowers etc.) on the quilt that can be added after the quilt is quilted.
- 8. Allow the quilter ample time to return your quilt...life happens. If you need your quilt by a specific time, let the quilter know ahead of time so he or she can tell you if that is possible.
- 9. If you follow these steps, your quilter will be able to complete your quilt much faster, and you will save money. Some quilters charge \$30 per hour to iron, square, and fix problem places in the quilt top or back. This can add up to more money than you might have thought.
- 10. All quilting quotes are for the quilting only, not for anything else that the quilt needs, i.e., thread, batting, and binding. Binding costs from 15 to 25 cents per inch when machine stitched. Hand stitching the binding to the back can cost even more. If the quilter finishes your quilt (binding finishes the quilt) and the quilter has a tax number, they will have to charge tax on the whole project. This will add 9-10% to the total cost of the project.


SEWING THE BORDERS TO YOUR QUILT



After the body of the quilt has been pieced, gently press before adding borders. The logical place to measure the finished top is along its outside edges, and this is a useful measurement. However, measurements should be taken across the center and in at least two more places for both the width and length. If these measurements are different from that of the outer edge, accidental stretching has occurred. To keep the finished quilt as straight and square as possible, you must measure the centers.

BORDERS WITH STRAIGHT CUT CORNERS

Determine the length of the quilt border by measuring across the center of the quilt, and about half way between the center and the raw edge. Take these measurements and find the average. Cut two border pieces that length. Divide the border piece and the corresponding quilt edge into quarters and mark with pins. Pin the border piece to the quilt edge, matching pins, easing or stretching in the fullness as needed. Sew and press. Repeat for other side.





Determine the width of the quilt border by measuring across the center of the quilt, measuring from the raw edge of the (just applied) border. Measure again about half way between the center and the raw edge. Take these measurements and find the average. Cut two border pieces that length. Divide the border piece and the corresponding quilt edge into quarters and mark with pins. Pin the border piece to the quilt edge, matching pins, easing or stretching in the fullness as needed. Sew and press. Repeat for other side.

Continue to measure this way for every border that you need to apply to the quilt.

Veterans Donations 2021

COMMUNITY SERVICE – GUIDE DOGS

This year, we are trying out a pattern donated by Rhea Fetter. It is really charming and I hope the picture will give you an idea of what to expect. We will be making it one row and one column bigger so it will be 5×6 for a total of 15 dogs and 15 trapezoid blocks.



The dog blocks are to be a picture of your dog. Take one, send one you love, to me via email. Please try to send the original picture, full digital size as I will be printing them on fabric. The finished image will be 10x10" plus seam allowance. We will be adding pre-cut borders to bring the blocks to 12x12 finished.

Kits will also be provided for the trapezoid blocks. These do involve a mitered join which is not as hard as it looks. We will be doing some sort of zoom/in person meeting to learn the technique. There will be more than 15 kits and the extras will be used along with extra dogs to make quilts that can be given to GDA for the in-year raffles, or for prizes in the guild.

Rita Percer found some of the fabric on sale and I am going to check Rye Canyon Supply for the dog related prints such as the border and in some of the blocks. I will be needing volunteers to make kits! Let me know if you are willing. Text, email or in person work for this.



APRIL BLOCK OF THE MONTH - SAWTOOTH STAR



This is the first of two blocks that will go together to create a star and heart quilt. There are many ways to create the star block, but with the pre-cut pieces in this month's kits, these directions will work best.


Your block should be 12 ½" UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 12".

For each block, you will need:

Fabric/Color	<u>Cut Size</u>	Quantity
White fabric (solid or small print) - Center Square - Rectangles	6 ½" sq. 3 ½" x 6 ½"	1 4
- Square Corners	3 ½" sq."	4
Mid-tone Floral Fabric		
- Squares	3 ½" sq.	8



SEW ALL SEAMS A SCANT 1/4"



Trim Excess fabric ¼" from outside the diagonal line and press to the floral fabric.




Match another 3 ½" floral square to the other corner of the white rectangle RST. It will overlap a little at the center. Sew on the diagonal line. (Fig. 2)

Trim Excess fabric and press. This makes 1 Flying Geese unit.

Repeat steps and make a total of 4 flying Geese units

Combine Units



Combine Units

Lay out (1) 6 ½" white square, (4) Flying Geese Units and (4) 3 ½" white squares.

In Row 1, sew each piece to the next. Press seams to the white squares.

In Row 2, sew each piece to the next. Press seams to the center white square.

In Row 3, sew each piece to the next. Press seams to the white squares.

Sew Row 1 to Row 2, matching and locking seams.

Sew Row 2 to Row 3, matching and locking seams. Press.


