On my porch currently are a number of kits for a variety of wheelchair projects, small and large lap quilts and 6 bed quilts needing to be quilted. Next week I hope to work with Kendra and put out some quilts that require binding, a few additional kits and a few smaller quilts that will be spray basted. Keep up the good work!

The items are available in boxes on my front porch. The flip lids can be tricky to open. First box is for returning items, second for things needing binding, next two boxes of kits, fifth are spray-basted quilts with size attached and in the lawnmower box are the bed quilts. Be sure to sign in/out in the book. There are pens - clean mug, then "dirty" mug. Also, some hand sanitizer. If you are concerned about leaving them, knock or ring bell or text me to let me know they are there




