For those of you who worked through the struggle of the perfect quarter-inch seam, please make sure to return them at the October meeting so they can all be put together. It's going to look great! I will not be at the October meeting, but will arrange to have someone sitting at my usual table.

The October/November block will be the last block of the year. This block is called "Picnic" and is by Cluck Cluck Sew. The fabrics were pulled at the Guild Fabric Sale with multiple opinions expressed (haha.) It is definitely a block that looks odd by itself, but once all the blocks go together, it looks like woven strips. Pick up a kit and give it a try! And make sure to read the note about how the colors of red and blue may vary by kit.



By Cluck Cluck Sew



Seam allowances are ¼". All seams are sewn with fabrics right sides together.


Final size is 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square with raw edges. Blocks will be 12" finished in quilt.

*** NOTE - KITS MAY HAVE RED OR BLUE COLORED FABRIC AS EACH FABRIC NUMBER. DO NOT GO JUST BY COLOR. GO BY PIECE SIZE. ***

Fabric/Color

Fabric 1: 2 squares 3" x 3" and 1 strip 3" x 5" Fabric 2: 1 strip 3" x 8" Fabric 3: 1 strip 5" x 8" Fabric 4: 1 strip 5" x 7 $\frac{1}{2}$ ", 1 strip 5" x 3" Background - Gray: 4 squares 3" x 3"


1. Layout the block pieces as shown in Fig. 1




 Sew the 3" background squares (gray) to the top and bottom of each 3" colored square from Fabric 1 as shown (fig. 2). Press the seams toward the colored fabric.



3. Sew the 3" background square strips to each side of the 3" x 8" of Fabric 2. Press seams in towards the colored strip (fig. 3).





- 4. Sew the background square unit on the top right to the 5" x 8" strip from Fabric 3. Press seam toward the strip. Sew the 5" x 7 ¹/₂" and 5" x 3" strips from Fabric 4 to the top and bottom of the 3" x 5" strip from Fabric 1. Press seams out towards fabric 4 strips (Fig.5).
- 5. Sew two sides/block units together (Fig. 5). Press seam open, this seam will not nest during quilt assembly.

6. The block should measure $12 \frac{1}{2}$ square (Fig. 6)





