We invited the Glendale Quilt Guild to bring their lovely Golden Poppy opportunity quilt. Tina was delighted that so many members purchased tickets for it. All the quilt guilds have been struggling to keep up with expenses. We have been fortunate that we were able to sell masks and bring in money that way as well as our membership dues...we as a board thank you. Your dues are needed to keep the guild running especially since we were not able to have a quilt show this year. We did save some money not having to rent the church and have in house speakers, but we still have to pay for our SCCQG dues, insurance, storage, batting etc. to keep your community service projects on track. That said, we are on track for our Turtle Camp quilts, Pregnancy Center newborn sets, placemats etc. We donated well over 2,000 masks to our community and hospitals. You have done outstanding service and each of you should receive an award!!

The next couple of months will still be different. Our October meeting will be on Zoom and will have a show and tell theme. Have your projects ready to share that night. November we will have a Zoom speaker and the following Saturday will be a Zoom class...check the workshop article for more information. In November, we are having a guest speaker – Elizabeth Eastmond of Opquilt.com. She is teaching a workshop - also over Zoom – on November 14th. It is her Merrion Square project – a colorful 25" finished piece that can be done in a day. Because the workshop is virtual, the cost is *only \$25*.



The supply list for the workshop is available here: Merrion Square. Elizabeth also recommends you have a small 4 ½ or 5" ruler on hand to trim the roof tops. The workshop will begin at 9:00 AM over Zoom and run until 11:30 AM. Then we will break until 1:30 PM for lunch/independent sewing. There will be an afternoon session of about an hour and a half and a follow-up session on November 21st in the morning for project show and share. Call or email me as soon as possible if you want to take the class – we have a limited number of participant slots available. Send me a check by snail mail to hold your seat. When I receive your check, I will send you the workshop Zoom meeting instructions.

If you paid in advance for workshops this year and want some of that money put toward this workshop, let me know when you reserve your spot. The board has decided that, if you paid for multiple workshops in the first quarter of the year, and want a refund due to all the cancellations, you just need to contact me to arrange for the refund. COMMUNITY SERVICE – VETERAN'S PROJECTS

I went to the Cal Vet apartments in Westwood on the VA grounds today (Sept 23). They have close to 500 apartments there. Years ago, they asked local guilds to supply a quilt for each incoming vet which is how we got involved. We contributed about 40 during that effort. Now we have added to the total with 10 additional bed quilts. Athena (my contact) says there are several vets who are very eager to get one. She also accepted 9 lap quilts (good for use in the chair that is in the room for them to sit and work, read or watch TV and 18 wheelchair quilts. I had noticed a number of vets are using that mode of transportation on my last visit. As I left I looked in the side mirror and saw Athena showing a wheelchair quilt to one of the women vets sitting in her chair on the patio. It made me smile too - it happened to be the one that Kris Dolan had quilted and Kathleen Dolan had bound. Athena asked me for the address for the guild. A thank you is on its way from someone. We as a group have brought some joy into lives today.

Outstanding projects (available for pickup on my front porch or by delivery at your request):

<u>Bed Quilts</u> - I have over 10 in my possession that need quilting. If binding is included, you are not required to sew it on unless you want to. I do have people waiting who like to put it on. They can be picked up off my porch out of the lawn mower box.

<u>Lap Quilts and Wheelchair Quilts</u> - spray basted. I have several projects that have come back in the last two months and need to cut backing, batting and then baste them. If you are looking for one in the next two weeks, let me know and I will get one ready. They will be in the box labeled Spray Baste Quilts.

<u>Kits -</u> We have everything from kits for wheelchairs to beds and in between. The current kits have completed blocks, patterns for a suggested assembly and sashing, possibly even borders. You may chose to do something different, but return any fabric not used. If you need more fabric, let me know and we will get some. Sometimes the packets contain backing and or binding in addition to borders. You do not need to finish more than the top, but if you

don't please return the fabrics so we can add batting and pass them on to the next person. There are two boxes with assorted kits.

There are a few clothing protectors (vests) with finishing instructions. This pattern has shrunk in the copying. If we will be making more, I will be issuing a new pattern. I am trying to locate the contact as the Rehab unit is now a Home for Heros - community living center - to be sure that they still would appreciate our help. The ones I currently have as finished will be offered to the Cal Vet assisted living facility if I cannot find her.

Be sure to sign out in the book on the little table. There is hand sanitizer there for your use as well. Please call or email me if you have any problems with our kits/quilts and remember I do have fabric that can be used to make blocks, sashing, borders, backing and binding. I have a large roll of batting as well. Send me the size you need and I will get it cut and make arrangements to deliver if needed.




