PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Happy October, my quilty friends!! I have mixed feelings about this month: I love it because we Californians usually start to really feel the cooling effects of autumn, but I dislike it because I turn yet another year OLDER!! I look at my husband and wonder how he ever got so gray, then I do the math for myself and write a thank-you note (a la Jimmy Kimmel) to my hairdresser!!

I was hunting around for a topic to write about this month and came across some 2021 quilting trends. What do you know? Our last workshop, featuring "Curved Piecing," was right up there among the top trends. Our guild has had two workshops with curves over the past few years – one involving large curves and 24" finished blocks, and the other just this last week with 6", 9" or 12" blocks with curved pieces. I continue to be surprised at how easy those curves are – not that I am ready to do a clamshell quilt just yet, but I am not as afraid of it as I used to be!

Another trend is what they call "Eco Quilting." This concept involves re-purposing fabrics (tshirts, denim, etc.) into quilts. Sounds to me like what our fore-mothers used to do over a century ago with bits of old dresses and such. It also encompasses using every last bit of fabric – so there are no leftovers or throw away pieces. Which leads to raw edge applique and other methods of creating a large piece of fabric out of a lot of little pieces attached to each other. I will admit, not my cup of tea, but I have seen some lovely art pieces using this technique.

A third trend is "Quilting for a Cause." I immediately thought of our Sew Powerful purse efforts and all the many projects we complete for Turtle Camp, Veterans, SCV Senior Center and the like – our guild is certainly very trendy in this regard! I so appreciate all that you do to support these charitable organizations.

I hope you are all able to attend our meeting in October at the church! I look forward to seeing everyone there!!

TAKING ORDERS FOR BATTING

We will be ordering batting from Hobbs for Community Service projects in November. Debbie Ackerman has generously offered to use her resale license to order the batting at a wholesale rate. Each roll of batting is 120 inches by 30 yards, 80% cotton 20% polyester. The cost of each roll will be \$182.50 - \$183.00, which includes shipping. Note: the batting cost went up 7% in May and trucking costs \$45.00 per roll. 





SEPTEMBER & OCTOBER BLOCK OF THE MONTH - BORDERED STARS











Step 3 and Step 4





Your block should be 10.5" UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 10". For each block, you will need:

Fabric/Color	<u>Cut Size</u>	<u>Quantity</u>
White fabric (solid or small print) - Flying Geese background	4.75″ x 4.75″	1
- Star Corners	2" x 2"	4
Colorful Fabrics		
 Flying Geese star legs* 	2.75″ x 2.75″	4
 Star Center Square* 	3.5″ x 3.5″	1
 Side Borders** 	2.5″ x 6.5″	2
 Top & Bottom Borders** 	2.5" x 5.5"	4

*Use the same fabric for the Star (Flying Geese star legs and Star Center Square) **Use 6 different coordinating fabrics for the border strips

SEW ALL SEAMS AT 1/4"

<u>Step 1:</u>

Use the 4.75" White square and the four 2.75" Colorful fabric squares to make one set of 4-at-a-time Flying Geese (to get 4 geese) and trim each goose to 2" x 3.5". Refer to the March 2021 "Four Patch Diamonds" block of the month pattern, or watch the video on the SCVQG website for instructions on this technique.

<u>Step 2:</u>

Sew the Star Block together as shown.

<u>Step 3:</u>

Sew a $2.5'' \times 6.5''$ Colorful fabric rectangle to the left side of the Star Block. Press the seam towards the border strip.

<u>Step 4:</u>

Sew a 2.5" x 6.5" Colorful fabric rectangle to the right side of the Star Block. Press the seam towards the border strip.

<u>Step 5:</u>

Place two of the 2.5" x 5.5" Colorful fabric rectangles right-sides together and sew on one of the short sides to make a long strip that is 2.5" x 10.5". Press towards the darker fabric. Repeat with the other two 2.5" x 5.5" Colorful fabric rectangles.

<u>Step 6:</u>

Sew one of the Border units from Step 5 to the Top of the Star Block unit. Sew the other one to the Bottom of the Star Block unit. Press the seams towards the border strips. The completed block should be 10.5" square.

Thank you for helping! These blocks will be used to make lap (42" x 54") quilts for Turtle Camp.

When putting the top together, we'll alternate orientation of the blocks. Here's a mockup of how the top will look.


STITCH N CHAT MINI GROUP
