GUIDE DOGS OF AMERICA

This year we tried something different, and the pattern turned out to be much more difficult than we realized at the beginning. However, Melissa took that block in hand and with the help of our members and the Monday Mavens, we made all the alternating cross blocks. On August 22nd, we met at Melissa's home to sew borders on the printed dog pictures that some of you sent to me. We had more dog photos than we needed, so we chose which to include in the main GDA quilt with the first criteria being the quality of the printout, but definitely with cuteness coming in a close second. The remaining dog photos were placed in a smaller quilt for the GDA's silent auction. We'll meet again August 29th at Kris's house to put the borders on the large quilt.

In two years, we will return to a format similar to what has been done in the past. If anyone is interested in taking over this responsibility, please get in touch. It takes about 8 months of supervision and we have helped to raise part of the \$20,000 plus it takes to put one dog with a blind handler or PTSD veteran.

The GDA sells tickets in a manner similar to our opportunity quilt. It is basically the same rules. I found this year's quilt in the newsletter (under news & events) on their website. What they do as an organization goes way beyond dogs for the blind!

BLOCK OF THE MONTH

We have had a wonderful response to the August Block of the Month! We love seeing your creations using your own scraps. When we put them together, they will become beautiful and useful creations. We are continuing with the same block, Scrappy Framed Pinwheel, for the

month of September. If you are not able to pull from a variety of scraps, we do have a limited number of kits available. Please let us know if you need one and we would be happy to get it to you.

Because we are using the half square triangle (HST) technique for the pinwheel portion of this block, you will have a matching set of HSTs to then use for a second block. But please do not make both blocks the same. Move things around a bit and use different corner square fabrics. The more fabrics, the better!! The instructions are included in this Newsletter and on the website. Feel free to let us know if you have any questions.

SOUTHERN CALIFORNIA COUNCIL OF QUILT GUILDS

Information about the meeting is contained in their newsletter which is available on the website at SCCQG.org. Please check there for summaries of both the business and general meetings.

Business Meeting notes:

- 1) Fees are being raised on our insurance. It currently costs about \$35,000 a year and is going up. If you need an Insurance Cert renewal, they will be sending out a list of the regular facilities. You will get an invoice for this. Please wait and send a single check for both things if applicable. Please no checks until we get fee change. It goes to Monica Sayers. Remember no certification is required unless a facility requests it. We are insuring for general liability only, damages done to the facility that are our responsibility only. No medical unless at a member home which should be covered under theirs. If fall or accident, still submit the claim. Homeowner's is primary. Directors and Officers liability still covered for inadvertent acts, defamation of character.
- 2) Meet the Teacher chairperson needed handles coordination, reaching out to applicants, review and set-up. Contact board if you are interested.
- 3) Road to California Report. Olivia Carnabas Quilts for 2023 sought. Information in SCCQG newsletter. Spotlight will be on So Cal Quilters & their quilts
 - Class registration is open and some are already filled. Opportunity Quilts are being accepted for display requires 20 hours of support over the 4 days of the show. Seeking volunteers to help email info@road2ca.com if you would like to help.
- 4) Pam Overton, Nominating Committee. Slate for this October: President, Program Chair, Newsletter Editor, Recording Secretary. 4 board members each year are elected for 2 year term.
- 5) California Heritage Quilt Arlene Stevens. Statewide effort to document California quilts over 40 years. Check council website for more.

6) Patricia Westbury - Camarillo, CA Quilt Project - Involved with Navy, heavily involved in San Diego. Recognition awards to sailors, monetary and other types. Sailor of the year & junior sailor of the year. All submariners want a quilt as well and there are 138 to be made. They have done 90 and need 50 more. Quilts are donated and shipping is paid. Parameters: 50x70 for bunks. Patriotic classic quilt combine colors RWB. Pattern includes the command logo which you request - send name, email, mailing address. Due 12/1/2022. Label - put on guild, sign by members or can be anonymous. Patches on photo finish fabric. \$10 on Etsy. Use your stash. Suggest for a jpeg to improve quality.




For scrappy look, please do not use any duplicate color prints within a block.

Your block should be 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square UNFINISHED. Finished Size (once sewn into the quilt) is 12".

For each block, you will need:

| Fabric/Color | <u>Cut Size</u> | <u>Quantity</u> | |

| White fabric (solid or small print) | | | |
| Squares used for HSTs (for 2 bl Rectangles | locks) 4 1/4" square 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" | 4 4 | |

Mixture of Small Scale Prints for Scrappy Look (no 2 fabrics the same)

- Squares used for HSTs (for 2 blocks) 4 1/4" square
- Squares used for outer corners 3 1/2" square 4

Create Half Square Triangles (HST) for Center Pinwheel

- 1. On the four $(4 \frac{1}{4})$ white squares, draw a diagonal line on wrong side of fabric.
- 2. Place each white square right side together with a $4\frac{1}{4}$ " color print square. Sew scant $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from both sides of the drawn line.
- 3. Cut along the drawn line to make two half square triangles (HST) from each color print.
- 4. Open HSTs, press seam allowance toward the color. Trim each HST to be a 3 ½" square.

YOU SHOULD HAVE TWO HSTs OF EACH COLOR. SEPARATE INTO TWO SETS. YOU WILL CREATE TWO SIMILAR BLOCKS.

USING ONE SET, CREATE ONE COMPLETE BLOCK

- 5. Create pinwheel center. Be careful of placement of color print triangles. We need all our pinwheels going the same direction.
- 6. Using a scant 1/4" seam, sew into rows.
- 7. Press each row. (Pressing seams open is recommended by some. Others prefer to press to one side. Your choice.)
- 8. Sew rows together, matching seams, and press block. Block should measure 12 1/2" square.

NOW MAKE THE SECOND BLOCK WITH COLORS IN DIFFERENT POSITIONS.


