#### **COMMUNITY SERVICE – VETERAN'S PROJECTS**

Thank you to everyone who took bed quilts for quilting, lap and wheelchair quilt spray basted for quilting and the kits for assembly. Any questions or need more of something, let me know. Additional projects in these categories are in labeled (and closed) boxes on my front porch. A sign-out sheet with pens in a clean mug (place in used after) is there so I can keep track of what is "out". Hand sanitizer is also available.

Kits are in two groups - those for wheelchair or lap-size in the second box, larger for large lap or twin bed size for the Cal Vet facility in the second. Return finished project and reasonably sized fabric in the bag. In a few cases we may have added binding or backing in the kit. You don't have to finish it, but if you wish, the batting is in my garage.

The fourth box contains some spray basted wheelchair or small laptop quilts. The fifth box (a lawn mower box) contains bed size for Cal Vets which are NOT spray basted.

I will bring things to the September meeting, but I am keeping things on the porch if you want to pick something up another time. The boxes should be closed if there is anything in them so the sun doesn't damage the fabric. The hand sanitizer can be used before opening and when you leave for your safety. With the current heat, this should not be an issue!

Thanks again for the marvelous support. The Cal Vets are very excited and I will be taking guite a few wheelchair/laptop and four bed guilts to them next week.

#### **BLOCK OF THE MONTH**

I am happy to report that I have collected 96 blocks since our stay at home time started. Thank you for continuing to make blocks which we will use for the children at Turtle Camp. I did a new pattern last month, which you can find under BOM on our SCVQG website. It is an "X" block or "kiss" pattern with a pinwheel center to go along with the previous "O" block or "hug" pattern. These will look great together or alone for the kids to enjoy.

Our guild is planning for another drive through meeting for our September 10th meeting date. I will have paper copies of the "X" pattern available for pickup at my table, as well as a basket to collect all the blocks that you have been making. I will fill out your tickets for our prize drawing for you – one for each block.

I also plan to have some more baggies of cut fabrics to use in making this pattern – you just need to add the white background squares. I passed out 34 of these last month! You can always use your own fabrics from your stash if you prefer.

Additionally, I will have some "kits" made up of some of our blocks and the sashings and borders along with directions to sew up the guilt tops. I hope you will be able to help out and take one!


