
Wear comfortable shoes, sun protection and bring water. It can get hot but one never knows anymore about the weather. It is always fun and there is lots to see and do.

I delivered 5 quilts, 5 girl burp cloths and 5 boy burp cloths along with bibs to R I S E. Meghan was very excited and grateful! She said they clients love them, and they go fast. Please do not attach a tag or label to items you turn in for donation as we sew our guild label to our quilts etc.



Lana K your prize from last month's meeting will be waiting for you at the community service table.



BLOCK OF THE MONTH

Block of the Month: I will have a new pattern for those interested in doing month to month blocks.

Mystery Clue 3:

This clue has three different blocks. Block A is similar to a block you have already completed with a small change.

Block B and C are super easy. Yay!

Helpful Hints:

*Starch your fabric.

*Do not cut all the fabric for that clue at once. Cut your fabric for Block A, and then make the block. Then do the same thing for Block B, and then Block C.

*Put a line down the column for the 12" block (assuming you are making the 9" block), and cross off anything related to the 12" cuts.

*When you print out the instructions, write your fabric choices on the blocks. This has been helping some of us with the visualization of the blocks.

Beyond Blessed © Debi Montgomery Clue 3

This clue brings us three more block styles. Block A is very similar to the one we assembled in Clue 2, just one unit in it is different, but changes the entire design!! Blocks B and C are more EASY blocks with only HSTs, squares, and rectangle units. This clue is super easy! Let's just jump in and cut and assemble these. Block A charts are VERY similar to their sister blocks in Clue 2, watch the ACCENT and FOCUS. We have already cut the FOURTH!

Clue 3

Page 1 of 4

This block is assembled EXACTLY like Clue 2 Block A with one little tweak. We will replace the BOLD square in the corner with a BOLD/ACCENT HST unit, which we assemble just like we did the FOURTH fabric in clue 2. Here is our deconstructed block:

Once complete, you should have TWO of these, pressed and trimmed to 9-1/2" or 12-1/2". The smaller squares should measure 5" or 6-1/2" each.

Let's grab our largest BACKGROUND and ACCENT squares and create some HST units. Once assembled, press toward the darker fabric and trim to 3-1/2" or 4-1/2".



That's the hard part done! Let's assemble some "strips".



You should have enough to complete four of these.


These should be pressed in the most flat way for you, but a hint would be to press these the opposite way you did the Clue 2 blocks that are similar.

You will have four of these 9-1/2" or 12-1/2" blocks.



Block C: easiest yet, and we only need TWO


