SCCQG - MINUTES

The Southern California Council Quilt Guilds quarterly meeting was held on October 12, 2024. The topic was affordable programs. With speaker and workshop fees as high as \$1000, SCCQG was looking at how to have affordable programs. Some of the examples that were mentioned: members led workshops, outreach to local vendors and low-cost or free presentations. Some examples were: "Show your Bag", "Strip Poker" with husbands and sons as dealers, and "Unfinished Quilt Show".

On a more serious topic was false emails sent to members. If you receive a request for money or gift cards from one of our guild officers, click on the sender and see the sender's email address. Our guild will never ask for money, help pay a vendor, or request gift cards. In the past, we did ask for unused gift cards for raffle baskets, but the request would be mentioned at a guild meeting and in our newsletter. Block the sender. BLOCK OF THE MONTH

We will be doing a cute snowman quilt for the months of November and December. Kits will be available to be picked up at both meetings. All blocks will be due at the January meeting. This will be a raffle quilt, and depending on participation, we may have 2 winners.

Each kit will have the fabric needed for a nine-patch block and a snowman block. Please complete both.

Your first block is a nine-patch block made from the provided nine 5" blue squares. Sew them in any order you wish. It is meant to be scrappy.

Your second block is the snowman block. You will use the remaining four 5" blue blocks marked with a diagonal line, one 14" white square, an orange nose (that has fusible web ironed on the back), and two black buttons.

To make the snowman: Place one blue square on a corner of the white square, right sides together. The diagonal line needs to run from one side to the other side (not from the corner towards the middle of the block). Sew on the drawn line. Do this for the three remaining corners. Please go to the link if a little extra help is needed.

After the four corner squares are sewn on, trim away the extra triangle material and press.

Next, pull the paper from the fusible web and iron on the orange nose. For the last step, sew on the two buttons for the eyes.


