THE DEAR JANE QUILT- THE 2026 GUILD PROJECT- OH DEAR!

OH DEAR! Dear Jane update.

Melissa, Claire, Jerri and I are moving along getting ready for the official DEAR JANE Guild Quilt roll out in January. We have worked on rows A-D and are making kits that use Applique, Traditional Piecing or Foundation Paper Piecing. In December and January, there will be sign-up sheets for each technique. Please sign up for what you are interested in doing so we can be more efficient in handing out each kit.

On JANUARY 31, we will be having our first DEAR JANE FPP class at Sara's from 12:30 to 3:00. This will be after the Quilt Show meeting that is 10-noon (approximately) No lunch provided. Excited to get this going.

For those who want to make the WHOLE quilt (OH DEAR!), we will be forming a DEAR JANE THERAPY group. To do that, you need to contact Marcia and let her know your intent AND what days and times you are available to meet. Melissa and Jerri have the EQ DJ add on and for those who are making the entire quilt, they will be able to send you patterns and instructions via email when they send them to those who are making the kits. Any questions? Be sure to ask any of us. Happy to Help.

***** You don't have to make all 225 blocks to be involved with Dear Jane. You could perhaps choose a few blocks you want to try - 4, 9, 16, 25......so the end product would be a square. If you love appliqué, there are about 60 to choose from and the rest are either traditional piecing or Foundation piecing. Want to learn a new technique? Try it on a Dear Jane journey.

VA PROJECTS - CAL VET DONATION

We are taking the quilts and vests that I have had returned to the VA if we can make an appointment before December 15th. If you have anything to send, please contact me and I will make arrangements to pick them up.

In January and February, we are planning on having two meetings to do kits for 1) blocks and 2) vests. I have 2 or 3 small quilts I will be basting. At the meeting, I plan on bringing block kits, kits of fabric with patterns, vest kits, the small quilts to be quilted (spray basted) and one large quilt for longarm quilting. I have approx 6 longarm quilts. I need to be able to get into storage to get exact numbers. Remember I do have some backing and binding fabric and lots of batting available to support you. For batting, email me the size needed including overage for quilting shrinkage.
