Now instead of a drab tan metal building you will see a vintage looking red firehouse topped with a true vintage bell. The design was created by local craftsman, Lucas Chavers, Cash Money Services.

Papaw's Albums Find There Way Home

Two long forgotten 1950's photo album/scrapbooks finally found their way back home to family members by the efforts of several good Samaritans: the Randy Robinson family, Pam Day, and Billie Bournias. Mr. Robinson's son had purchased the albums several years ago at a garage sale. After some time, he gave them to his parents to see if they might know to whom they belonged. Mrs. Robinson then gave the albums to John Day thinking they might be related to the original owners, as many military memorabilia mentioned the names of John J. and Marguirite Day. John passed them on to his parents, Billy Jim and Pam Day, hoping they might know if a relative or not. No connection was found to their DAY family.

Pam Day contacted Billie Bournias, a well-known DAR genealogy researcher, to see if Billie could help track down someone in the family. Billie instructed Pam to deliver the albums to the museum where others might be able to examine them. As a very ardent researcher, Billie was able to find names and clues. She was then able to track down **Paul Barnett**, the firstborn grandson of John Jay Day, Jr. Mr. Day's wife Marguirite Quarles was related to the Bell family of the Shanks community. This is how the albums landed in Freestone County. At one time some of the family lived in the Kirvin area.

The museum is very grateful to **Pam Day** and **Billie Bournias** for their diligence in seeing that these albums were returned to the proper family. Too many military and family keepsakes were inside to just be discarded or forgotten. The museum mailed the albums to Mr. Barnett on Friday, May 13. He was very happy to receive them and was very appreciative.

Historical Tid-bit

An exciting discovery was made while researching information for the 1881 Jail historical marker correction application. The initials of the first Sheriff to serve in the 1881 jail, Henry Jay Childs (1881-1888 and 1891-1892), and a following sheriff, James Norelda Haydon (1893-1896), were carved in the door jamb of the back door. Mr. Haydon could have possibly been a deputy sheriff during this time, but this is not known.

Unfortunately when the new doors were installed, the door trim was placed partially over the carvings, but the letters can all still be read. For years it was just assumed that the initials were of some long past inmate. To now know the significance of these letters brings history to life.
