1881 Jail Open Once Again

HOURS: Wed, Fri, Sat 10 am to 5 pm



If you weren't able to attend our open house on Oct. 2, you need to stop by and take a tour of the old jail.

Our community turned out in large numbers that day in support of their local museum and "hidden gem".

The building is celebrating 140 years of service: a jail till 1914, apartments till 1966, main museum till 2007; and now it is once again back to its original form as a jail complete with sheriff quarters.

Cutting the ribbon are board members, Don Awalt, Sherrie Minze, Nancy Rula, Leslie Tate, Linda Mullen, Curator Patricia Pratt, board members Brad & Diane Pullin.

It was an action packed day with the Old West Chronicles (J. D. and Christy Fox—Historical Re-enactments) performing a John Wesley Hardin Skit. The museum is very grateful for their participation; as well as to our emcee, Buzz Russell, speakers, Sheriff Jeremy Shipley, Mayor Kenneth Hughes, and musician Reverend Andrew Weitner—playing The Star Spangled Banner.

There has been much confusion through the years whether or not John Wesley Hardin actually spent a night in the old jail or not. One of the goals this year will be to have the jail historical marker corrected. The marker currently contains information about the 1857 jail which was located on the same site. Its foundations were uncovered when the chimney was added to the Carter Cabin in 1977. It is possible that J.W. Hardin may have spent the night in this much older jail. But the story still remains mostly legend.

An interesting Hardin family fact is that the 1850 sheriff of Limestone (pre-division Freestone) County was Emanuel Clements, Sr., whose wife was Martha Balch Hardin, Aunt of John Wesley Hardin. Emanuel was also the first county clerk of Freestone County in 1851, while his brother, William Clements was the first sheriff of Freestone County (1851-52). William shows up on the same 1850 census page as Daniel Potter of the Potter-Watson Cabin.



Ever heard of the Clements Gang? History seems to indicate that the Emanuel Clements children and the Hardin children, being first cousins, ran in some of the same circles together. By 1860 they had removed to Gonzales County.


She participated in both the Christmas parade and also Christmas at the Park., winning 2nd
