Unveiling
Ceremony
Oct. 5
10:00 am

Everyone is invited to an unveiling ceremony for our new "corrected" **1881 Freestone County Jail** Texas Historical Marker. The original marker was dedicated in 1967, but was determined to contain numerous errors. The information described the jail built on the same location in 1857. A corrected marker application was submitted to the Texas Historical Commission in 2022. It was approved and the new marker finally arrived this summer.

The museum board is very excited to unveil and dedicate this marker. We will begin our short ceremony around 10:00 am with guest speaker, William Shelton, chairman of the Freestone County Historical Commission in charge of the ceremony.

There will be free admission to the museum all day and light refreshments will be served. Please come and invite your friends and family to this historic event.

A very detailed article has been submitted to our local newspapers for publication which gives great detail explaining the corrections and gives some of the history of the 1881 jail. It will be worth your read!

Happenings





Please keep Nancy in your prayers. She is currently recovering from an illness. She will be greatly missed at the museum. May she be blessed with a full recovery.






