A MESSAGE FROM OUR CLUB PRESIDENT**Days at the Museum**

As most of you probably know my participation in classic Chevrolets includes about 50 years of Corvair ownership. In addition to trying to keep the cars on the road I also participate in the Corvair community through my participation as a board member on the Corvair Society of America, CORSA. It was through my participation with CORSA that I became a docent for a week at the National Corvair Museum (NCM) in Springfield, Illinois. The NCM is small, with about 12 cars, but includes the world's fastest Corvair (over 173 miles per hour at Bonneville), and the next to last Corvair built (a story for a different day).

This week was special for car enthusiasts in Springfield. The Great Race (www.greatrace.com) is following Route 66 this year for its 100th birthday and started in Springfield. The Great Race is an antique, vintage, and collector car competitive controlled-speed endurance road rally on public highways. No cars newer than 1974 (and some were from the 191x timeframe) are permitted and scores are adjusted for vehicle age. There were over 100 cars entered and I was able to enjoy watching them start the race as they left Springfield. Many brands were represented including domestic makes and foreign makes including Jaguar, MG, Datsun, and Mercedes. The race will end on Sunday, June 28.

We have two activities planned for July, both on the 11th. For early risers we will meet as a club in front of AJ's at La Encantada at 6:45 AM. From there we will travel to the north parking lot and participate in the Cars & Coffee at 7:00 AM. The goal is to participate together and encourage new membership in the CCCT. After a hard day showing cars, we have plans to cool off with ice cream at Handel's at the northwest corner of Ina and Oracle (7315 North Oracle Road). We will meet at 7:00 PM. Bring your ice cream appetite because Handel's has about 40 flavors and the helpings are generous.

Our next activity is on August 22nd at the Main Event (4700 S. Landing Way, 85714) for our annual bowling event. We have a reserved room with four lanes from 11:30 to 1:30. The CCCT covers the cost of the bowling, non-alcoholic beverages, pizza, and shoes. Mary Lou Lopez will be sending out more information and a sign-up sheet around the middle of July.

Have a safe Fourth of July and I hope to see many of you at our July 11 events.

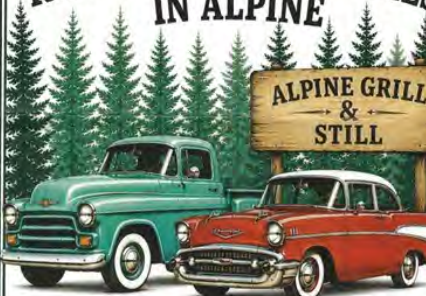

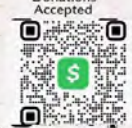

At 6,000 ft., this event provided a refreshing escape from the summer heat. Jerry and I took a drive from Show Low area for this Father's Day full of family-friendly hometown atmosphere. There was a Show & Shine Car show, fishing tournament, food & craft vendors.

Harold Davisson's feat was an exercise in archival preservation and material science. When most people think of a time capsule, they imagine a small stainless steel cylinder. Davisson's approach was an industrial-scale vault. To protect the 1975 Chevy Vega and the thousands of items inside, he utilized a 45-ton concrete structure designed to act as a hermetic seal. By isolating the interior environment from oxygen, moisture, and UV radiation—the three primary drivers of material degradation—he successfully paused the clock on 1970s consumer culture.

The 20% loss of items in the capsule highlights the difference between physical durability and informational integrity. While the Kawasaki motorcycle and the Vega survived because of their inorganic composition (steel, chrome, and synthetic paints), the "heartbreak" came from the loss of the metadata—the inventory lists and donor records. In archival theory, an object without its story is "silent." The stolen records meant that while the artifacts were recovered, the provenance (the history of ownership and origin) for many items was severed forever.

However, the success of the 1975 Vega's recovery is a testament to anaerobic preservation. Because the vault was so massive and deeply sealed, the lack of fluctuating temperatures prevented the "breathing" effect that usually draws moisture into underground structures. This kept the yellow paint from oxidizing and protected the magnetic strips of the cassette tapes from the mold that usually destroys analog media in damp environments.

When the pyramid was opened in 2024 and the vault in 2025, it served as a sociological experiment in generational continuity. The people who returned—now in their sixties and seventies—were the "living bridges" to the artifacts. The emotional impact of hearing a deceased relative's voice on a 50-year-old tape is a phenomenon of auditory memory, where sound acts as a direct trigger to the brain's emotional centers. Davisson's "man who never lost an argument" attitude resulted in a legacy that forced the future to stop, look, and remember.

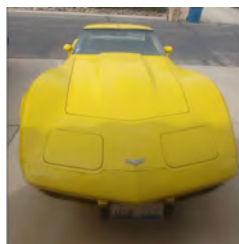
