Studies have shown that driving significantly slower than the surrounding traffic can increase the likelihood of accidents.


The Solomon curve, developed by researcher David Solomon in the 1960s, illustrates a U-shaped relationship between vehicle speed and collision rates. This curve indicates that vehicles traveling both below and above the average traffic speed have a higher risk of being involved in accidents, with the lowest risk occurring at speeds slightly above the average.

Driving slower than the flow of traffic can disrupt the natural movement on roadways, leading to congestion and unexpected braking. Such disruptions increase the potential for collisions, as other drivers may not anticipate the slower vehicle's speed.

Therefore, maintaining a speed consistent with the surrounding traffic is crucial for reducing accident risk and promoting smoother traffic flow.

7th Annual CCCT Poker Run Event

Well, I hope everyone has finally finished wiping, cleaning, and vacuuming their 'ride'! Ann's poker run took everyone out and into the desert of Avra Valley. I think it is a jewel to come over the three main passes that drop into Avra from Twin Peaks, Picture Rocks Rd, or Gates Pass – what a view of the distant mountains. And if you know where to look you can see a lighter sandy color which we have learned over the past several years is where the old Silver Bell mine, now owned by Asarco, is located.

This wasn't Ann's longest poker run but hopefully each of you did experience a different part of 'Tucson' and learned more about 'our' history. Our first stop was at the El Rio Preserve which is a known site along the Juan Bautista DeAnza trail with its beautiful lake. This Preserve protects 104 acres of riparian habitat.

After winding our way along Silverbell Rd, as it changed its name TWICE, how like Tucson, we turned onto Avra Valley Rd and arrived at our 2nd Poker stop at a memorial monument at Marana Airport honoring 19 marines who died onboard a helicopter crash in 2008. Everyone eventually did get all 5 darts onto the board!

Next up, we drove west on Avra Valley Rd; passing by many acres of green growing alfalfa with numerous desert dwellings and every type of discarded well-used items of endless description; soon turning into an attractive development of southwestern style homes. Here we were at Ron and Lila's GARAGEs and home! What a treat to everyone's eye. Ron has more vehicles in every state of repair (disrepair?), restoration, or let's just say it – in PARTS! Best of luck Ron, can't wait to see.... the old 30's Chevy running down the highway or even that Ford tractor trenching your 'south 40'

After keeping cool at Ron's but knowing we are on a schedule to reach the Silver Bell mine just a few miles up the road, we pulled out of their incredible backyard and cranked it up and paraded back out to Avra Valley Road and drove it into the Silver Bell Mountains.

We drive by the Ironwood National Monument passing through a forest of saguaros until we arrive at the Asarco mine guard house. But good and careful planning has the gates open and we are waved inside. We park together and walk over to the rock memorial monument dedicated to the abandoned town of Silver Bell – 1954 to 1984. We are greeted by Jim Hunter who lived in this town until 1971 and gave us a talk about 'his' town with photo exhibits and childhood stories.

The weather was finally becoming a bit more than bothersome so we thanked Jim and fired up our buggies and again headed out along Avra Valley Road. But not too far down the road Ann turned her truck off the road and onto a 'not too bad' dirt area and as good 'wing-men' should we followed and soon were parked around a most amazing site The Biggest and Largest Saguaro anyone has Ever seen! Right off the road --! So, everyone count the arms ... how many do you think there are?

But it's getting late and we are very close to our reservation time at the Circle S Saloon! Back into our wheels and off we go again,,, but only a short distance, and yes a little bit more dirt and dust --- BUT, tables are waiting and the food is Great –

You don't realize how tall the saguaro is unless compared next to someone, but Frank is a hard sample.

The Shiva Saguaro! 80 Arms!

Article in 2021 by ABC that this saguaro caught the attention of Bill Peachy and he reached out to share the backstory of "Shiva" the saguaro in Avra Valley with 78 arms. Its name references a Hindu god often depicted with many arms.

He said its arms have grown naturally.

When we think of the saguaro, signature plant of the Sonoran Desert, we usually think of a main trunk that can reach more than 30 feet in height with half a dozen arms or more arms. Ironwood Forest is home to a very special saguaro with more than 40 arms. Flowers form on the tip of the main stem and tips of branches. With this fact in mind, it would seem that more branches would equal more flowers, more seed production, and a better chance for the saguaro to reproduce. Saguaro researcher Bill Peachey says it's just the opposite. Each arm depends on the main stem for water and nutrients and there may not be enough for flowers on each stem.

Peachey believes that "Shiva" saguaro probably had no more than four or five branches until it was about 100 years old when a burst of hormones led to a proliferation of branches.

Is multiple branching a genetic factor that can be passed on to the saguaro's offspring? Since saguaros don't bear their first flowers until 60-80 years of age it's a question that's likely to go unanswered.

If you go to see the Shiva, please admire her from a distance. Saguaros are shallow rooted and too much foot traffic can lead to soil compaction and damage small roots. Please stay at least 30 feet (roughly the height of the saguaro) from the base. By doing so you can help Shiva survive to be admired by future generations of visitors to Ironwood Forest.

The saguaro cactus takes at least 75 years to grow a sidearm. Saguaro Cacti do not grow any arms until they are 70 to 100 years old, and can live for over two hundred (200) years.
