Hi-Speed Rods & Customs the newest occupant of 829 E 17th Ave. Many Tucson residents that grew up around the neighborhood remembered:

The Rainbo Bakery at 829 E 17th St in Tucson was once a bustling hub of bread-making that served the community for decades. Originally part of the Rainbo Bread Company—a brand known nationwide for its soft, fluffy loaves and iconic rainbow logo—the Tucson facility operated under the name Rainbo Baking Company of Tucson, incorporated in 1940.

After its baking days ended, the building found new life in Tucson's arts scene. In the late 1990s, the former bakery was transformed into a creative space by Orts Theatre of Dance, which established the *Tucson Movement Arts Warehouse* in the old garage and baking rooms. This adaptive reuse was part of a broader revitalization of Tucson's warehouse district, turning industrial relics into vibrant cultural venues.
