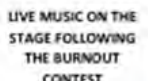

A gentleman approached her and said, "Pardon me, ma'am. I don't mean to be forward, but did you know that your dress is blowing up in this high winds?"

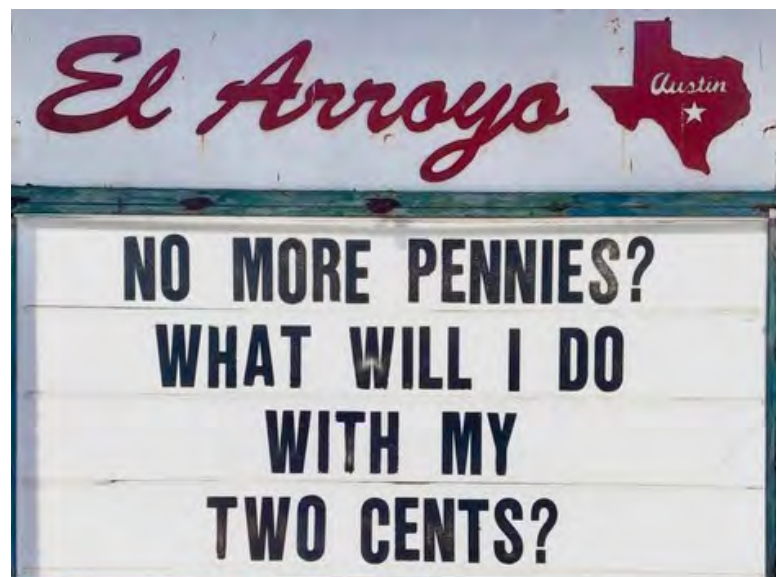

## Cruising the Mother Road: The Dettmanns and Newcombs Take on Route 66

There's something magical about the open road, especially when that road is Route 66—America's most iconic highway. For the Dettmanns and Newcombs, it was more than just a trip; it was a journey through history, small-town charm, and unpredictable weather.

The adventure began with a five-day, four-night classic car run, kicking off in Safford, Arizona. Stopped for lunch at a great place called "Jerry's Restaurant" love the name.

Continued to SR 191—formerly known as SR 666, the ominous "Devil's Highway"—set the tone for an unforgettable experience, winding through Hannagan Meadows, Alpine, and Eagar. At one point prior to stopping in Pinetop a deer ran out in front of the Newcomb's; very lucky they didn't get hit.

By 4PM, we reached Show Low. The next morning, we were greeted by relentless rain that exposed minor leaks through the doors of classics.

**Day two** brought us closer to Route 66 lore. While heading toward Holbrook, we eyed black clouds off to the northwest, but were relieved when reaching I-40 the storm was to the east. In Winslow, a must-stop at the famous "Standing on the Corner" statue allowed for a musical throwback moment, complemented by a visit to the historic La Posada Hotel. After doing a little shopping in the shops, we proceeded on; but Howard and Jeanie soon faced a challenge: no windshield wipers in sudden downpours, rain becoming an unavoidable theme. Our end for the day was at the Grand Canyon Railway & Hotel in Williams. Rainy evening we basically stayed in the hotel for the evening.

**Day three** was packed with adventure. We continued on to Seligman, a town known for preserving Route 66's spirit, our classic cars became a spectacle—locals and tourists alike snapping photos. After departing the town, we continued to stay on Old Route 66, past the Grand Canyon Caverns, through Peach Springs (and passing Hackberry General Store again by mistake) and arriving in Kingman around noon. We stop at Grand Canyon Distillery on Beale Street in Kingman for an enjoyable lunch before venturing onto Oatman. A tiny town of 98 residents known for its Old West ambiance and friendly burros roaming the streets. But prior to that, we stopped for iconic Route 66 photos in front of Cool Springs Station, then continued the winding road into Oatman. Found a great parking spot for the tourist to take photos of the classics while we stopped in the Oatman Hotel for ice cream cones. After spending hours soaking in Oatman's charm, darkening skies signaled us to return back to Kingman. Once checked in the guys found a self-service car wash that had become a necessity—Howard's running boards had so much mud, we joked about planting a flower garden on them. Afterwards we gathered around to discuss our stops for day 4.

**By day four**, the long-awaited sunshine finally made its appearance. Traveling south to Wickenburg via SR 93, we took a coffee and pie break at Luchia's Restaurant in Wikieup, where a surprise garden full of peacocks caught our attention. Then a detour led us to the town of Bagdad, a copper mining town with a great local eatery. In Wickenburg, upon our arrival at Los Viajeros Inn we were met with enthusiasm—the hotel manager raced outside, eager to photograph the classic cars. Following her recommendation, we cruised into town, parked in front of Rancho Bar 7 Restaurant for dinner. FIRST, Howard led us into the restaurant; we were seated. The waitress came to the table; that's when we looked at Howard. He was supposed to take us to the La Cabana Saloon for drinks first; we apologize to the waitress and did the long walk of shame out of there? When walking into La Cabana Saloon, we were greeted by the barmaid. She anticipated our arrival, the manager at the Inn sent photos of our cars to the Saloon. 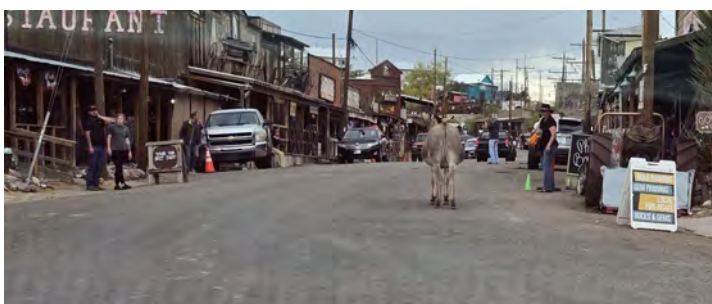
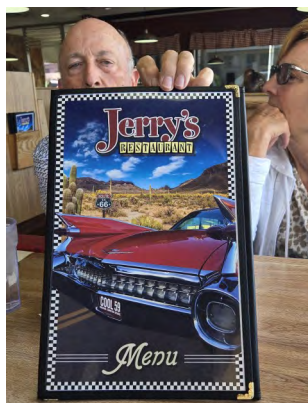
Homeward Bound

If you're going to have a senior moment... make it memorable.

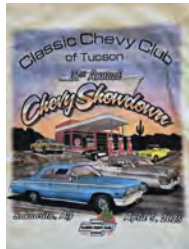

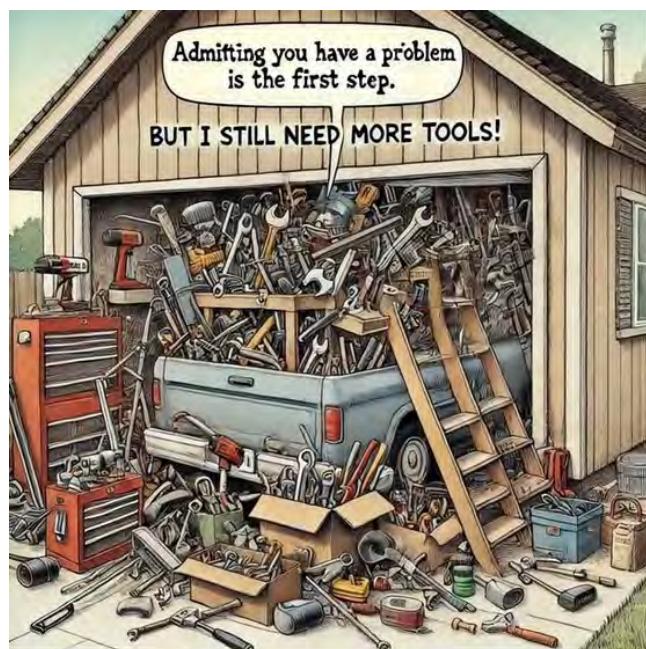
