Our next board meeting will be October 9th. If any member needs to raise business, please contact myself or one of our officers in advance of this so we can cover it.





Every autumn, the craving for pumpkin-flavored everything takes over, and this Spiced Pumpkin Hummus is no exception. It's a creamy, flavorful twist on the classic that's perfect for dipping or spreading.

### Ingredients

1 cup canned pumpkin puree

1 can (15 oz) chickpeas, drained and rinsed

1/4 cup tahini

2 tbsp olive oil

2 tbsp lemon juice

1 clove garlic, minced

1 tsp ground cumin

1/2 tsp ground cinnamon

1/4 tsp ground nutmeg

1/2 tsp salt



#### Instructions

In a food processor, combine the pumpkin puree, chickpeas, tahini, olive oil, and lemon juice. Process until smooth, about 2 minutes. Add the minced garlic, cumin, cinnamon, nutmeg, and salt to the food processor. Process for another minute until all spices are fully incorporated.

Scrape down the sides of the food processor with a spatula to ensure all ingredients are evenly mixed. Process for an additional 30 seconds. Transfer the hummus to a serving bowl. For best flavor, let it sit covered in the refrigerator for at least 1 hour before serving. Drizzle with a little extra olive oil and a sprinkle of cinnamon before serving for an extra touch of flavor and presentation.

Kick your snack game up a notch with this Spiced Pumpkin Hummus, which boasts a velvety texture and a warm, aromatic flavor profile. Serve it with crisp apple slices or toasted pita chips for a delightful contrast in textures.




#### THE ACTIVE MEMBER
