Richard Held was welcomed as guest, no new members. As a reminder to members: we are all interested in the care, driving and showing of all classic GM vehicles. Interested guests are always welcome to our meetings.

Officially, it was in 1916 that President Woodrow Wilson proclaimed June 14 as Flag Day, to be observed every year. Every year, the President in office should call on government officials and U.S. citizens to display the American flags outside buildings and their homes.

Some Facts About the American Flag

- The flag is nicknamed Old Glory and Star-Spangled Banner. The latter is the title of America's national anthem.
- Although this is not confirmed, it is thought that Betsy Ross, a seamstress who made the flags for the Pennsylvania Navy, had a hand in creating the design for the American Flag and made the first one.
- Although the Flag started with 13 white stars representing the 13 original colonies of the United States, one star was added for every state that joined the country. The American flag currently has 50 white stars.
- The Flag Protection Act was passed during the Vietnam War making it illegal to burn or destroy the American Flag. However, it was later ruled that this violated the First Amendment.
- The Flag Code states that representations of the American Flag should not be reproduced on apparel items, such as clothing, bedding, or decorative items.

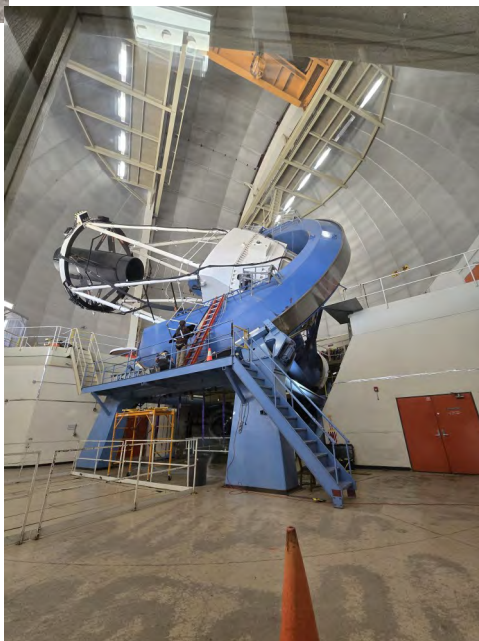

Kitt Peak Observatory - May 10th

What a fun day for a cruise to Kitt Peak Observatory. There were 10 members that were able to participate in this event. The trip started with breakfast/lunch at the Bisbee Breakfast Club on Ajo Hwy. Around noon we cruised an hour to Kitt Peak, the Dettmann's had some problems with our Malibu. First; the fuel pump stopped working then a mile later thought it was a vapor lock, but it could have been an ignition module in the distributor. The cooler temps were a welcoming from the desert floor. Our 1:30 tour was a short 0.9 mile walk to the Nicholas U. Mayall 4-meter telescope. Tour was inside and outside of what used to be the second-largest telescope in the world when it was built. It is host to the Dark Energy Spectroscopic Instrument built by the US Department of Energy, the most powerful multi-object survey spectrograph in the world. At the end of the cruise all stopped at Tiny's Restaurant on Ajo Hwy for a beer, that lead to dinner.

In honor of Flag Day

The Legend of Betsy Ross

The story about the creation of the American flag is shrouded in as much legend as fact. Elizabeth Griscom Ross, better known as Betsy, was a seamstress who lived in Philadelphia. According to legend, George Washington employed Betsy to embroider his shirt ruffles. His knowledge of her skill led to a meeting on June 1st when he, accompanied by Colonel George Ross and Robert Morris, presented Betsy with a rough sketch for a flag. Betsy's descendants claim that the three men requested her to create the depicted flag. At Betsy Ross's suggestion, Washington re-drew the design with five-point stars rather than six-point stars.



The 3-cent Betsy Ross stamp was issued January 2, 1952.

Generations of the Ross family passed down the story of Betsy Ross's involvement with the creation of the first official American flag. In 1870, William J. Canby, a grandson of Betsy, recounted the story at the Pennsylvania Historical Society. The legend of Betsy Ross and the creation of the flag spread until it became accepted as canon for most Americans. Historians, however, have another viewpoint of the story. In the years since this tale first came to light, historians have not been able to verify the claims of Canby, even after numerous and vigorous searches through diaries, letters, and journals of the Continental Congress. No record exists of a flag being discussed around this time. While many Americans still believe that Betsy Ross was responsible for the first American flag, and while it makes for a nice story, sadly, it is most likely false.

A 3-cent stamp featuring the tale of Betsy Ross designing the flag for Washington was issued on January 1, 1952, to commemorate the bicentennial of Betsy's birth. Immediately, the Post Office Department was flooded with letters from stamp collectors and historians alike who agreed that there was no authentic information to suggest that Betsy Ross had any role in designing the flag. The Post Office Department disagreed, claiming it had research and backing from the Library of Congress to proceed.
