



FLASH – Three CCCT members make the excursion in their classics to participate in Florence's *Main Street Car and Cycle Car Show*. February 22, 2025 – Location- Florence, AZ (photo & write-up Debbie Rosenberg)

The above is the short straight-to-the-point version of our 3-day stay at the Green Tree Inn. The real story starts as Bob and I in our Pontiac take the lead with Ann and Jay behind in what soon turns out to be the 'iffy' Apache Pickup, followed by

Blair and Junean in their Corvette. Both Bob and Jay do the usual pre-trip gas top off then we head up Ina Rd to Oracle Rd Take a note everyone, this was Not the best idea! The noon hour is Not the best choice going to Oracle Rd! But choose it we did and by the time we did the ridiculous left turn onto North Oracle we all were pretty much disgusted by everything --- but that turns out to be the easy part.

So northward we roll on and finally pass the last of the ever present street signals so our rides can step it up a notch and Junean and Blair can feel the wind in their hair. We make the turn onto Tom Mix's Highway 79 and 40 miles of open TWO lane road.

But hold it a minute.... My phone rings and Jay is telling us to SLOW DOWN, what? Why? Actually we're probably going between 60-65mph at that moment. He is saying something about the truck jumping and hesitating – but maybe the word was coughing and not jumping ... hard to understand and barely able to Hear! The wind, engine, car noises are overwhelming ... and guess what? There is absolutely NO pull-outs on Hwy 79 for 40 miles! The plan to arrive and drive around Florence to first see the lay of the land is put aside as we drive to our hotel, Green Tree Inn, also on Main St., but at the end. We find some open spots to park, but Ann just gets the truck onto a dirt spot and the truck dies! Oh my, will it start again

We do the check-in process but Jay, Blair and I decide to take the Pontiac and cruise the area while Bob, Ann, and Junean recover from the two hour drive which seemed like Forever! We scope out the blocked off areas and the routes into the early morning entry area. Happily by then Jay's truck did start and was re-parked. By the way we did receive detailed instructions on how to do all of this but of course we wanted to find an easier and better way....

After a very good dinner across the street, we agreed upon a 5.30am gathering in the parking lot and a pull-out at 5.45am... Mostly it worked pretty well but it was still quite dark and I did miss the all-important turn as we saw the long line of red taillights that we would soon join ... Soon we were in the long line, inching ahead but mostly just idling, and Freezing! It was COLD.... Very cold. The line grew longer behind but not in front – no movement, so Ann took to walking ahead and soon disappeared (it is Dark). There are a lot of guys way at the far end working hard to get each car parked in their required angled perpendicular way, one car at a time – Blair says we were in that line for an hour (we were close enough to see this – while so many were much further back and had No idea what the heck was happening). County alerting residents to phone scam

PIMA COUNTY, Feb. 18, 2025 - Some Pima County residents have reported receiving phone calls from County phone numbers with the caller purporting to be a County employee who is seeking to obtain personally identifying information or credit card numbers to pay a bill. These calls are NOT coming from the County. The scammers are using a Caller ID "spoofer" to masquerade as the County.

If you're ever uncertain if the person you're speaking to works for the County, ask their name and the department they work for and tell them you'll call them back and hang up. You can then go to www.pima.gov and search for the department and call the phone number on the page to verify they are a County employee and calling for a legitimate purpose. Or you can call 520-724-9999 and explain the situation to the County operator who will seek to verify whether the call is indeed from the County.

Already, the County was made aware of a customer who was contacted by phone from someone purporting to be from Pima County. The caller was asked to pay a bill, a permit or a fee, which they did, before discovering that their credit card was subsequently used for fraudulent purposes.

Additionally, if anyone ever comes to your home or business and says they are from the County, be sure to ask to see their County-issued photo ID. County IDs are plastic, the size of a credit card, and have the employee's name, photo, and department on the front and other identifying information on the back.

Any attempted fraud should be reported to the Arizona Attorney General's Consumer Fraud Department, www.azag.gov/complaints/consumer.
