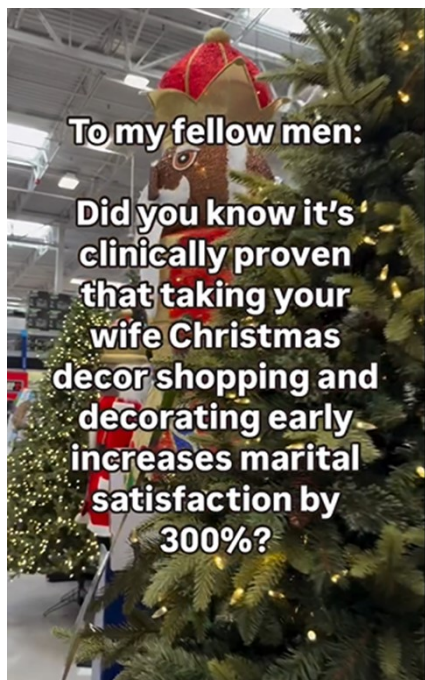
You know right from wrong.
