

The tour offered an appreciation of the risks and hardships that young Americans withstood while working to defeat Germany in World War II. One of the more amusing aspects of the tour was the number of mascots (pets) that rode along on the B17 missions. The CCCT wants to thank Matt for setting up this tour and Bill and Alex for giving us insights into the history of the 390th Bomb Group. By the way, if you want to visit the museum on your own, two of the docents are World War II veterans, one of whom was part of the 390th Bomb Group.
