



Jacqueline was born in Cuba and came to the USA in 1968 with her parents and one older brother to get away from communism. I was born in Guatemala and came to the USA in 1976 with my older brother and two sisters six months after a 7.5 earthquake destroyed a large part of the country. Jackie and I crossed our paths when we started having a few classes together at Bell High School and fell in love in our senior year in 1980. We both graduated HS, went to college and as soon as I received my Certificate in Machine Shop Technology and AA degree, I asked her to marry me (that is a funny story for some other time). We married on May 7th, 1983 and will celebrate our 42nd anniversary this year. We have two great kids (ages 40 & 38), and three grand pups.

My love for cars actually started when I was a kid, looking at beautiful American and European cars in Guatemala. As an example, the owner of the house where we lived had a 1967 Plymouth Belvedere and a 1964 Buick Wildcat. When I was 16 years old, I got my driver's license. I had started working part time in a small auto shop to learn auto mechanics and to save money for my first car. My brother's first car was a 1967 Caprice 2-door and then upgraded to a white 1971 Camaro RS with a split-bumper, a 350 V-8 and automatic tranny. Those two cars were the ones I tinkered with and learned to do tune-ups, brakes, etc. and practiced driving sometimes to get to school. One day in October of 1979, one of my step father's friends offered him an old car as payment for painting his 1967 Chevelle Malibu. The car offered was a 1956 Chevy Bel Air, 4-door, with a 283 V-8 motor and Powerglide transmission. It was really a rust bucket... a BIG project that I was all too happy to undertake. I paid my step father \$300 for it. It was so bad that Jackie called it the Flintstone's car because you could see the ground when you sat inside the car as the floors were rusted through. I had my work cut out for me, but I enjoyed every step of the way to bring that car back to life. The engine and transmission were rebuilt, repaired all the rust damaged floor with new sheet metal riveted and sealed in place, installed new upholstery including the headliner, carpet, seats, side panels, and package tray. Found a nice set of Rally wheels and got new tires. Replaced the front and rear bumpers for nicer ones I found in a junkyard (had to keep expenses to the minimum) and installed a stereo with 8-track, equalizer and about 8 speakers. I remember listening to the cassette soundtrack from the movie Grease.... It sounded so good!!! After all that was done, I sanded the car and applied brown primer with my step father on December 31st 1980. That made a great difference in how the car looked. It was a decent daily driver now. Eventually we painted the car in two-tone burgundy and ivory white to match the interior upholstery. Had it about two years and when it develops transmission problems, I sold it for \$1,500 and upgraded to a 1976 Cadillac Seville. Loved that Seville's style and performance. Went from a former rust bucket to a top luxury car and learned to appreciate those older Cadillacs as I owned three other Sevilles later on and a 1985 Eldorado Biarritz.

In 1995 we made the decision to move from LA to Tucson. Jackie and I were both able to graduate from the University of Arizona in 2000/2001 and both obtained our BS degree. I was soon promoted to Shift Supervisor and later to Continuous Improvement Manager while working for Parker Hannifin in Tucson. In June of 2009, Parker made an acquisition in Gardena, CA and asked me to transfer there to help them in the transition process. We had just finished building our dream home in Vail, AZ in 2007 after selling a really nice 1975 Caprice Classic with a custom paint job to help with the building costs. Long story short, we moved back to CA and stayed there until the end of October 2019 when we decided to start our early retirement plan and returned to Tucson. In 2021, I saw a CL ad for a 1972 Pontiac Lemans in Cave Creek. We took a drive to go check it out and decided to buy it as a project. It had the original exterior paint and interior upholstery, but needed restoration. We had the interior and vinyl top done complete and a new exterior paint in Natural Khaki green. Had the two bumpers re-chromed, a set of new tires, stereo system, alarm, power door locks, and complete front suspension and shocks upgraded. The 350 engine and TH350 transmission had been rebuilt 6 years earlier by the previous owner. We were ready to go cruising! Joining the CCCT has been fun for us as we have met lots of great people and can participate in their monthly activities and car shows in and near Tucson. We look forward to making more great memories with our family and new club member friends who live in this great city. Cheers... happy & safe travels!!!


